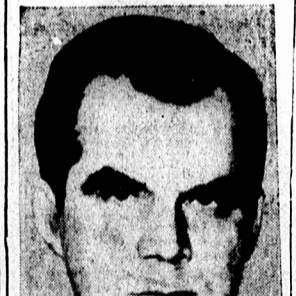

Newsman Tells Of Battle At Bou Arada

They were after some British tanks near us. We left our car in a mad rush finding little cover on a bare plain. It is terrifying business flitting out on level ground and seeing the enemy circling for diving bombing. Explosives and machine gun bullets burst 25 feet away from my photographer companion.

Even a tank colonel was with us on the bare plain. We then drove into a farm and from a slit trench I watched bombers attempt to attack a tank concentration. Only three or four tanks came over at a time but they were an ominous sight. Three of them bombed tanks ineffectively and three others raved over shortly afterwards.

The attack was right on the mark and a Bofors gun manned by British soldiers hit one of the bombers dead centre. It burst into flames at 200 feet and crashed by land Bou Arada. A second bomber was hit but glided to a crash landing to the north. As the Nazi planes were hit, Tommies around me cheered as if at a football game.

In and out of town we went a couple of times with guns blazing out an inferno of fire all the time. We kept saying it was absolutely fantastic—our wandering about a front like this. The Tommies thought it was a big joke seeing a couple of war correspondents, unarmed and in a French sport car, racing around like mad.

These personal experiences are only a fraction of what troops are going through all day. But even for war correspondents it has been a frantic action. These British troops know how to fight and these professional soldiers are more deadly than the Hun and the Jap, for like all fifth columnists, they are often not detected until it is too late.

During the period of 1914-18 the Allies lost thousands of man-hours, vital to the conduct of the war, as a result of the infection of men in the armies of these diseases. Spread by promiscuous sexual indulgence, they left, in a great many cases, a terrible legacy for the generation to come. The cycle of repeating itself, limbs, ravaged bodies, paresis of the brain, insanity, death—these are the fruits of syphilis and gonorrhoea. The cycle is repeating itself and to a large extent, girls who indulge in promiscuity without infection in centres where training camps and barracks are situated.

The incidence of syphilis in Canada, we know is on the rise. Let us as citizens not let this picture pass before our eyes as in the last conflict. We must fight these two dread enemies with all the means at our disposal. The elimination of prostitution is a major necessity. This can be done by means of effective education, law enforcement and law enactment, and the provision of rehabilitation facilities.

"It is our duty," Dr. Bates went on, "to present the complete facts regarding syphilis and gonorrhoea to all in combating ignorance by that end Social Hygiene Day, under the sponsorship of the Health League of Canada, will be observed in Canada from next night on February 23rd. Let it be understood, however, that the drive against these enemies will not stop there, but will be continued relentlessly throughout the year.
