AUSTRIANS STEADILY DRIVING RUSSIANS BACK

VIENNA, Aug. 17.—Austro-Hungarian troops pursuing the retreating Russians have advanced to Debrynka, thirteen miles south-west of the fortress of Brest Litovsk, according to an official statement issued to-night at the Austrian War Office. The statement says: Austro-Hungarian troops are sharply pursuing the enemy, who is continuously retreating. The pursuing troops under Field Marshal Von Arz, have advanced to Debrynka, twenty kilometres south-west of Brest Litovsk. The Russian rearguard taking positions near Pizag were beaten back by the Hungarian Landwehr. Forces under command of Auchduke Joseph Ferdinand are advancing on Janow. General Von Koeyess has beaten the enemy back across the Bug in the region of Konstantynow, north of the lower Bug the German and Austrian cavalry are fighting together. On the front near Vladimir Volynskiy and East Galicia the situation is quiet. The fire of Italian heavy artillery against our Tyrolean defence works continues feeble. Hostile infantry detachments advancing on the Val Sargana to Garzano, north-east of Borzgo, have been beaten back. In the Coastal region the Italians continued attacks against our positions, but were repulsed.

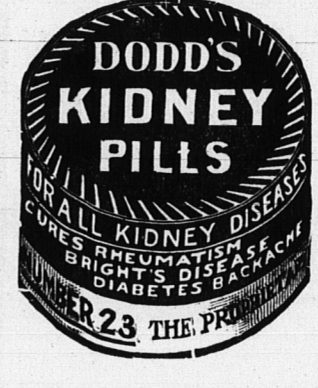
