THE GOLDEN FELT.—Mr. J. R. Barr, one of Charlottetown's most progressive young business men, and an expert in advertising, has just issued a handsomely got-up book on the black fox in P. E. Island, entitled "The Golden Felt," a tale of black foxes, whose silver tips are worth their weight in gold. Mr. Barr has put his artistic talents to good use and his book is printed on fine India tint coated book paper, the cover being of specially ordered yellow American card with an outer tissue cover attached by a silk cord. It is a delightfully dainty souvenir of the P. E. I. fox industry, and has a great advantage in being a convenient size to carry around in the pocket for reference at any time. Mr. Barr's purpose is to advertise the Island black foxes, and those alone, and has had printed ten thousand copies, about half of which he intends sending to the New England States and other points where the fox investors have not yet made known the priceless industry now being carried on so extensively in "The Garden of the Gulf." The leading newspaper of the different provinces will also receive a copy. Mr. Barr will place a limited number on sale in Charlottetown at 50c. per copy, foxmen, who require same in quantities, being given a special rate. The book is exceptionally well written and gives a clear and concise history of the fox industry from the first ranch, with its two pairs of Anticosti silvers bought from a trapper for experimental purposes only, until today, when P. E. Island black foxes are known the world over. The photographs reproduced, the first of which is the father of the industry, Hon. Charles Dalton, are works of art and give some of the finest fox photos ever reproduced in this Province and show the foxes in many natural poses. Altogether the book will make an ideal souvenir to send to friends abroad and will greatly assist in "boosting" Prince Edward Island.

GOOD WORK SHIPPING at the Port of Victoria for the first ten days in December. The firm of Wright Bros., have made a record for late shipping at above port having loaded the following schooners, in ten days. Lizzie Catherine, Capt Miller, for Sydney with 3,100 bus potatoes, 2000 bus oats, 250 bus vegetables, 12 dressed hogs, and 3 qrs. beef. Roma, Capt. Alfred McLeod with 5,400 bus. potatoes, 1250 bus oats for Halifax; and H. H. Kitchener also for Halifax with 4,100 bus. potatoes, 200 bus. turnips and 2500 bus. oats, making a total of nearly 19000 bus. Above schooners have all sailed for their destination.

A TRAVELLING ART GALLERY.—The State of Kansas has recently started a travelling art gallery. It contains 400 carbon, photogravures and engravings of the greatest pictures of all the schools of art. These are arranged so that each school—French, Italian, Flemish, German, Spanish, English, American—can be studied systematically. Any responsible organization in the State may have the use of the gallery by giving a bond and paying the expense of packing and express, but no community can have it more than a week until all the first calls have made. The pictures may be had by clubs, but the chief use of them is to show them in schoolhouses, which are more and more being used in the United States as meeting places for the people. Mrs. Kate A.
