NEW MONEY FOR UNITED STATES

WASHINGTON, June 6. Treasury officials are preparing to put into effect the new currency law. Printing of the new notes will begin within ten days. The new notes will be identical with national banknotes, except that the legend on the face instead of being "secured by bonds of the United States" will be "secured by bonds of the United States or other securities." Smaller denominations probably will be issued first, as each autumn there is a heavy demand for small notes, especially from the West and South. As soon as the department is ready to supply the new notes in any quantity required, no further issue of the present notes will be made, the present notes being destroyed as fast as they reach the Treasury for redemption.

LIVING ON THREE CENTS A DAY.
LONDON, June 4.—The Rev. J. D. K. Mahomed stated at the meeting of the Bury St. Edmunds Guardians on Thursday, that he knew of cases in which men in receipt of out-door relief had to keep a wife and family of three or four children on the money allowed, which worked out at three cents a head per day.
