MR. SANKEY IN EDINBURGH

Will Establish a Training School for Gospel Singing.

Mr. Ira D. Sankey addressed a great gathering in the Free Assembly hall on Tuesday Oct. 16, upon the subject of Sacred Song and Story. Half an hour before the time advertised for the meeting every seat in the hall was occupied; a little later all the passages were blocked, and later still hundreds of people were going away disappointed, having been unable to gain admission. It was, however, afterwards arranged to have an overflow meeting in the Free High church; and that building was filled a few minutes after the doors had been opened. Professor Simpson presided. Mr. Sankey, after telling his audience some of his amusing experiences in connection with the rumor which had got abroad that he was dead, said he was always glad to come to Edinburgh, and as he stood in that hall he could not but recall some of the former visits he had paid to the city in the company of his late friend and colleague, Mr. D. L. Moody. He referred to Mr. Moody in most affectionate terms, and remarked that though he was now dead the good work he had begun would be long continued.

Mr. Sankey afterwards addressed the overflow meeting, and in the evening was present at a crowded meeting in Free St. George's church, where he discoursed on "Singing through Palestine and Egypt."

THE QUID PRO QUO.

LONDON, November 20.—In return for the support given by Germany to Belgium in obtaining for the latter a settlement at Tien Tsin consisting of a strip of land on the left bank of Pei Ho. King Leopold has agreed to the rectification of the frontier near Lake Kivu between German east Africa and the Congo free state in favor of Germany, thus terminating a boundary dispute.

AFTER AGUINALDO.

MANILA, November 20.—General Macabulos (the former Filipino chief) is prepared to start in pursuit of Aguinaldo with one hundred picked natives, supported by American troops. Other rebel Filipinos will be used in campaigning the country. The offers have not been made yet, but they are ready if the authorities will accept them. Aguinaldo is supposed to be in Northern Luzon.
