### Publicity For Canadian Willard Company

Word has been received here by Vincent Windsor, of Bourke-Windsor Service Station of an important victory for the Willard Storage Battery Company of Canada over the sales organization representing the Willard company in the United States.

As a result of this victory, in what is the biggest event of the year among Willard men, there was brought to the Dominion for the first time a few days ago a cherished silver loving cup, awarded each year to the Willard sales district making the best record for the past 12 months.

The award was made at the annual meeting and banquet of the entire Willard sales organization in Cleveland, and the cup was proudly borne to Toronto by Mr. J. T. Foster, general manager of the Canadian Willard company; Mr. F. W. Bryan, sales manager, and the various district representatives who attended the Cleveland gathering.

While the cup has been a much-prized trophy for seven years, the Canadian Willard company, having been formed in 1920, has had an opportunity to compete for it only during the past two years. In the short period, Messrs. Foster, Bryan, and their associates have succeeded in dotting the map of the Dominion with Willard Service Stations, so that today there is not a town in Canada with 250 or more cars which does not have at least one station, and in 1922 they trobled the sales volume of 1920.

"We have been aided in this, of course," said Mr. Foster, "by the fact that Threaded-Rubber Insulation, which is used in the most advanced type of Willard Batteries, makes a particularly good battery for such cold weather service as is required here in Canada.
