UNIQUE MACHINE.—Much interest was manifested in the demonstration at the Experimental Farm last week of a Cleveland Tractor by a representative of the Frost & Wood Co., and many citizens stopped Saturday to inspect the curious-looking little machine in front of the Company's store on Queen Street. It resembles somewhat in appearance the famous tanks of modern war, running on its own endless tracks, which conform to the unevenness of the soil and enables it to travel easily over wet ground or sand and through ditches and gullies. The machine can be used for a great number of purposes, including plowing, harrowing, discing, seeding, pulling a mower or binder, hay-loading, manure spreading, well-sawing, plumbing, ditching, excavating, road grading and many other uses, which may suggest themselves. Another demonstration of it will be given today at the Experimental Farm.
