MONTREAL, May 31—Cattle prices were generally steady with an easier undertone, particularly on common to medium cows, on Maritime markets today.

Good heifers sold from \$6.50 to \$7.00 with an odd choice heifer up to \$7.25.

A few steers were sold for export to Great Britain. Common veals were just steady, other kinds 25 cents higher and drinkers or pall fed calves were fully 25 cents lower than at the close of last week.

Good spring lambs weighing 50 pounds or better brought \$6 to \$7.50 each. Lighter lambs of common to just fair quality made \$4 to \$5.50 each.

There were no early sales of hogs.

Graded egg shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 21 1-2 cents a dozen for grade A-large, 20-20 1-2 for A-medium, 19-19 1-2 for grade B and 18-18 1-2 for C.

Butter was quoted at 24 3-4-25 for cartons or less of No. 1 white lots to retailers were 25 1-2 for solids and 26 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 14 3-4-7-8 for Ontario while Quebecs were unquoted.

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, May 31—Wheat futures wound up an erratic display on the Winnipeg grain exchange today with losses of 1 to 1 3-4 cents when the weights tipped to the bearish side from effects of weak Liverpool cables, improved crop conditions in North America and death in export trade.

At the final bell wheat futures were: May \$1.23 7-8, July \$1.21 3-4 and October \$1.12 1-8-1-4.

Earlier prices had reversed two-cent losses into one-cent gains on speculative strength derived from Spanish war news telling of Germany's bombardment of the port of Almeria.

Bright spot of trade appeared in May oats which moved independent of other grains and went off the exchange board in spectacular fashion with an advance of 4 3-8 cents, at 60 3-4A, in its last day of trading.

World wheat shipments for the week totalled 11,863,000 bushels.
