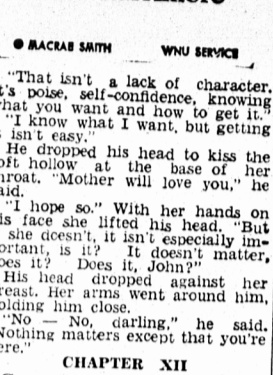
THE COOK'S CORNER

- POTATO DOUGHNUTS
2 eggs
1 cup sugar
1/2 cup mashed potatoes
1 cup milk
1 cup flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
3 tablespoons melted shortening
Add beaten eggs and sugar to mashed potato. Then add sifted dry ingredients alternately with milk.

- ICE BOX ROLLS
1 yeast cake
1-2 cup lukewarm water
1 cup milk
2-3 cup shortening
2-3 cup sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup of hot mashed potatoes
2 eggs
About 4 cups flour
Scald the yeast in lukewarm water. Scald the milk and water hot add the shortening, sugar, salt, and mashed potato. Cool until lukewarm, then combine with the yeast and add the well-beaten eggs. Add enough flour to make a stiff dough. Turn out onto a floured board and knead until smooth. Put into a greased bowl, brush over with melted shortening, cover and place in the refrigerator. When wanted, cut off as much dough as is needed and shape into rolls. Let rise until over (425 degrees F.) This dough will keep several days.

- CREAM CHEESE ROLLS
2 packages cream cheese
1 tablespoon grated orange rind
1-2 teaspoon ground ginger
2 teaspoons thin cream or milk
1-2 pound gingersnaps
Mix cream cheese, orange rind, ginger and cream together, shape into finger-like rolls 2 inches long or into balls. Roll in sifted rolled gingersnap crumbs. Chill until firm. Serve with salads. Recipe may be halved.
