Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

[The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must be a Canadian citizen or a person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entries by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency on certain conditions.]

Entries—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live with in nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or on certain conditions. A homestead is performed in one of the following ways:—

1. In certain districts a homestead in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section on alone side by side. Price \$3.00 per acre.

2. On the Six months residence in each of three years. The homesteader may live with in nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or on certain conditions. A homestead is performed in one of the following ways:—

3. A settler who has exhausted his homestead rights may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. The homesteader may live with in nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or on certain conditions. A homestead is performed in one of the following ways:—

4. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
