TRAGEDY AT ST. ANDREWS. ST. JOHN, N. B.—A very sad drowning accident occurred at St. Andrews Thursday night, when the horse of Hugh E. McQuoid stepped off the bar in crossing from St. Andrews to Minister's Island and the driver, Hugh E. McQuoid, of St. Andrews, and his companion, Miss Annie Murphy, were drowned. The young couple were returning from a party in St. Andrews, and Mr. McQuoid was taking Miss Murphy to the house of the late Sir William Van Horne on Minister's Island, where she was employed as domestic.

Tuesday morning Henry Hooper, a fisherman, saw the horse of Mr. McQuoid floating near a pier and knowing how many people have been caught by the bar, he, together with William Mitchell, made a search and soon the body of McQuoid was discovered on the beach. The body of Miss Murphy has not yet been recovered, and it is being grappled for. It is supposed that, crossing the bar, the horse lost its footing and fell into deep water, drawing the carriage and its occupants after it. The smothered cries of the drowning ones was not heard, and their soaked clothes soon dragged them under. The only clue as to the time of the disaster is that Mr. McQuoid's watch had stopped at 9:15.

Mr. McQuoid is the son of Hugh McQuoid, of St. Andrews' and a cousin of Fraser McQuoid, who was killed at the front last week. Miss Murphy had just come over from Ireland via Montreal a short time ago and has no relatives in this country. Her people have not yet heard of the tragic accident.

OTTAWA.—Sir Robert Borden made a definite statement to the Great War Veterans' Association last night that the Military Service Act would be enforced before the elections. The veterans presented a petition to the Premier endorsing conscription.

"It is with peculiar pleasure that I thank you most heartily for your resolution endorsing the conscription bill," he said. "No one can realize the necessity for sending reinforcements to our brave Canadian lads at the front as thoroughly as the men who have served and who have come back."

"There are some here no doubt whom I have had the pleasure of meeting at 'Plug Street' two years ago, or in the hospital in France last March. It is my duty to remind you of the great part which you have all played in the world's theatre during the last three years. You have all shown yourselves worthy to fight with the best. Canada is playing a great part and you, on behalf of Canada, have already played a great part."

Sir Robert regretted that the Government had found it necessary to enact a compulsory service bill.

"But we have put our hand to the plow," he said. "And it is our duty to see the thing through with all our resources."

"We hear a lot of talk about holding up the bill until after a general election, but no one is foolish enough to think that the Germans are disposed to wait for eloquent speeches and general elections. We are determined to carry this measure through to the end."

Capt. J. E. Macpherson, on behalf of the returned soldiers, welcomed Sir Robert and referred to the resolution which had been unanimously adopted at a recent meeting of the Ottawa Association.

"We will back you up in anything you do to make the citizens of this country do their duty," he said.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) PETROGRAD.—Russian national debt, which at the beginning of the war, was nine billions of roubles, is now estimated at fifty billions, according to a report of the Imperial Bank. Its statement shows that the money circulation is 13,646,000 roubles, against 1,633,000,000 at the beginning of the war.

Credit notes issued the first five and a half months of 1917 amount to 4,549,000,000 against 3,475,000,000 for all of 1916. General operations of banks have largely increased during the war. The gold reserve in Russia has fallen from 1,504,000,000 to 1,292,000,000.
