### EDITOR'S MAIL.

#### ILLEGAL TROUT FISHING.

Sir:—Kindly allow me, through the medium of your column to call the attention of the powers that be to the following facts:—On Saturday last, Nov. 24th, a certain man was seen, on the shore of the stream leading to the Hatchery pond at Southport, carrying a pitchfork and a string of trout in direct violation of the fishery regulations. Some may call to mind that last winter complaints were made that parties had been fishing for several weeks in the Hatchery pond in consequence of which the Fishery Overseer visited the pond and made a feeble attempt to capture the offenders. It is currently reported that it is no unusual thing, in certain portions of the Island, for parties to be seen carrying strings of trout at this season of the year in contravention of the fishery laws. Inquiry will prove, however, that such places are like the Hatchery pond in one respect viz. there is not a member of the Protection Association living in the vicinity. In Charlottetown there reside a Fishery Inspector, an Assistant Inspector and a Fishery Overseer and yet within a couple of miles of their office illegal fishing has been and is carried on and no record has been made of a single conviction in the whole county for several years. Trusting that the paid Government officials will awaken from their comatose condition and get to work in earnest and not leave all the work of protecting the Island fisheries to patriotic private individuals is the sincere wish of

## CANADIAN HORSES WON AT NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Nov. 22.—Equine quality in all gradations and society leaders, and the votaries of wealth and fashion in this and many other cities, combined to make the opening of the Horse Show at Madison Square Garden a splendid spectacle of life, light and color last evening, with the spacious tan bark alive with successive competitors for the coveted blue ribbon going through sprightly movement before glittering vehicles or topping fences, bearing gentlemen riders and the boxes and the big space enclosing the arena crowded with men and women, the latter spangled with jewels and dressed in the acme of the modes of the day, the show was well up to the name it has gained as mirroring New York's riches and its wonderful capacity for display.

The result of the jumping event was a triumph for Canadian horses, both first and second places being taken by horses from that country. Lord Minto winner of the first prize is owned by George Pepper, of Toronto. Confidence, who was second, is owned by Capt. W. H. Evans, of Montreal.

The largest prize of the day, in point of monetary value, was the \$300 blue ribbon, carried off by Surprise exhibited by the Ranocas Stock Farm in class I. for thoroughbreds.

The honor of having the largest number of entries is held by Alfred G. Vanderbilt, with his brother Reginald a close second. Out of New York, the largest number of entries is by John J. Braton, of East St. Louis, Mo.

## LIEUT. PEARY MEETS HIS WIFE

STONEY, N. S., Nov. 21.—Lieut Peary will leave on the noon train tomorrow for New York. The Roosevelt will remain here for some days yet as the most of the present crew will be paid off here, and a new crew hired to take the steamer to New York.

The Royal Cape Breton Yacht Club tonight tendered Peary an informal reception. Peary was only present for an hour. He spoke briefly, thanking the members for their kindness.

The explorer came ashore from the Roosevelt in a press tug. The landing was made but a short distance from the hotel at which Mrs. Peary is staying, and as the tug cleared the wharf Peary was standing in the bow talking to a number of reporters, when glancing up he saw Mrs. Peary at her window. "Excuse me, gentlemen," said the Explorer, and he leaped from the tug to the wharf. In a few minutes, husband and wife met after a separation of sixteen months.

## FRENCH STATE AND THE CHURCH

TROYES, Department of the Aube, Nov. 23.—The inhabitants of the neighboring towns surrounded and barricaded their churches when the authorities attempted to take the inventories today, but they were overpowered by troops. A priest at Saligny, who violently resisted, was arrested and taken to prison.

LILLE, Department of the Nord, France, Nov. 22.—A captain of the 8th Infantry who refused to obey an order to-day to break down the door of a church in order to enable the authorities to take the usual inventory, was replaced by a lieutenant. During the taking of the inventory the lieutenant was seriously wounded.
