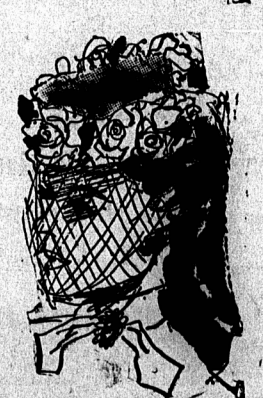
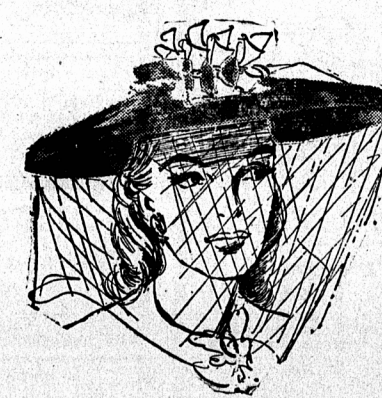

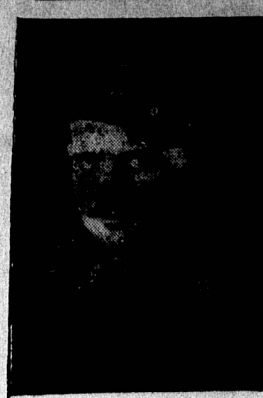

**This War—Four Years Ago**
