Fairchild was harder in aircrafts. Dominion Textile was a loser in its section. A winner in beverages was Canadian Breweries, while Labatt and Seagrams ceded a boost and in arrears were Alco "A" and "B". National Breweries was off "a" time. Commercial alcohols dipped. Bell and Gaitneau advanced in utilities. Winnipeg Electric firmed to hold a gain and falling back were S. C. Power, Brazilian, Power C., Quebec Power, Shawinigan.

Montreal Power and Ottawa Electric Steamship was up in carriers. Noranda and Aluminum were higher in metals. H. B. Mining dropped an increase and Nickel and Smelters were in arrears. McColl and B. A. inched down in refineries.

McInyre was on the downside in golds. In junior mines, firmer were Sladen, Elder, Pitt, Goldvue and Sheep Creek. Laggards were Normetals, MacDonell, Louvicut, Sullivan, East Sullivan, Buffington, Santigo, Sherritt, Central, Cadillac, Jollet, El Sol, O'Brien and Stadacona.

**Resist Loss Trend On New York Mart**

**NEW YORK, Oct. 22—(AP)—**  
Stocks generally backed into losing territory today although a number of market leaders resisted the trend and finished in the plus column.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 3 of a point at 62.9.

Canadian issues were off fractionally. Both Dome Mines and Canadian Pacific slipped 1-8. McIntyre and Hiram Walker (new) each slipped 1-4. Giant Yellowknife and Lake Shore on the curb were both unchanged.

Allegheony Corp Preferred and Prior Preferred pushed up 1 1-2 at 34 3-4 and 4 1-4 at 58 3-4, respectively. American Woolen Preferred lifted 1 1-4 at 168 1-2 and the Common 1 3-8 at 53 1-2.

Others on the upside were Santa Fe, Southern Pacific, Great Northern, Du Pont, Allied Chemical, Distillers Corp, Continental Baking and General Electric. U. S. Steel converted a morning loss into a final advance of 1-4 at 70 7-8.

Bethlehem Steel yielded 1 1-8 at 94 5-8. Youngstown Sheet 1 at 65. General Motors 1 1-8 at 50 1-8. Chrysler 1 1-4 at 50. Western Union "A" 1 1-4 at 18 7-8 and Schenley 1 1-2 at 60 1-2.
