The Hotel Davies was offered for sale at noon yesterday by auction but not disposed of. J. H. Welsh, late manager of the Sun Life, offered \$10,000, M. P. Hogan \$15,000, Welsh \$16,000, Hogan \$17,000, Welsh \$18,000, and then James Paton bid \$18,500. This was the highest bid and F. L. Hazard announced the reserve bid as \$25,000.

HORSE NOTES.—J. P. Woodbury's trotting mare Sweet Singer, 2 3/4 dropped a handsome filly on April 8th, sired by the well known stallion Kalol, owned by J. M. Nicholson of this city. It will be remembered that this foal was shipped over to Kalol last season from Nova Scotia. Mr. Woodbury has refused the handsome sum of \$100 for the foal.

The distribution of the new boxes in the Post Office will be continued this morning from 10 to 1 o'clock.
