SPECIAL LAWS SUGGESTED TO SAVE RICHESON

or any other murderer sentenced prior to its passage, Richeson's sentence calls for execution in the week beginning May 19.

If carried out with the success and dispatch talked of today by sponsors of the idea, such a measure, they say, would enable Richeson to get imprisonment for life. Legislators and lawyers feel such a step would be impossible under the circumstances.

Attorney William A. Morse, of counsel for Richeson, stated today that he didn't think there was any great prospect in such a suggestion.

although he considered it resourceful.

"Anti-death bills are entered annually in Massachusetts," said Mr. Morse. "They are just as regularly defeated. I doubt if it would be possible to bring about special legislation in time. But while the State doesn't seem to be prepared just now for the substitution of life imprisonment for the extreme penalty, it is bound to come."

The Executive Council's refusal to intervene in the Phelps case was palpably a severe blow to counsel for Richeson and the prisoner himself who heard it yesterday in his cell at the Charles Street jail. Richeson had been pinning strong hopes upon the Council's decision in the Phelps case. While his attorneys and supporters will not confess it, the decision in Phelps's case is looked upon as virtually an adverse verdict in Richeson's case.

Although his attorneys fully appreciate the new and discouraging obstacle that has been raised by Phelps's defeat, they are far from the point of surrender. They intend to conduct a campaign upon their own lines and expect by a volume of evidence concerning Richeson's mental state and by scores of signatures eventually to save him from the chair. However, it is admitted even in Richeson's camp that the outlook is dubious just now.

A well known preologist has visited the office of Attorney Morse in a persistent effort to gain permission to examine Richeson's head and write a treatise on it. Counsel has told him several times that such a proposition is out of the question.

It has just been learned that Richeson and Avis Linnell sat on a bench in the Public Gardens forty-five minutes on the afternoon of Saturday, October 14, during the last try and that while there Richeson passed her the fatal capsule with instructions how and when to take it.

After leaving the Gardens they lunched at the Oak Grove Farm Cafe, and later strolled along the mall on Commonwealth avenue to Massachusetts avenue, where Richeson boarded a trolley for the home of Violet Edmunds, in Brookline. It has been learned also that most of his numerous affairs of the heart were with women of middle or advanced age, according to officials who compiled his life history from the cradle to his arrest in mid-October.

Though all the world turns against Clarence V. T. Richeson, his aged father, Thomas Varland Richeson of Virginia, will not disown him. "I will stick to my son to the end," says the father.

Despatches from Lynchburg, Va., say that Thomas Varland Richeson was asked in that city today.

"Mr. Richeson, is the statement made in some of the papers that you disown your son, now that he has confessed a true statement?" The father said vehemently: "That statement is a lie. There's not a word of truth in it. I do not disown my son. I will stick to him to the end."

R. E. Richeson, brother of Clarence, said a few minutes later: "Father is terribly broken up, but, as he says, he will stick by my brother to the end."
