Thirty-seven thousand dollars was the amount of the consideration involved in the purchase this week by E. H. Beer and Dr. H. N. Goff of the J. L. Rose property on the east side of Sixth street between B and C. The property is described as the south half of lot D, block 19, Horton's addition, being 25x100 feet, improved with a two-story brick building. The new owners bought the lot as an investment. Dr. Goff is an oldtime resident of San Diego, while Mr. Beer is a comparatively new arrival, having come to this city with his family from eastern Canada four or five months ago. He has unlimited confidence in future values of local real estate, having made a number of investments in this besides that in the Sixth street property. He was here a month or so when he entered the realty business under the firm name of Beer & Essery in the U. S. Grant hotel. This sale follows several large deals recently consummated on Sixth street. There is a big demand for property on this thoroughfare. Within the last two months the entire frontage has changed hands on the block in which the Rose building is located, excepting 25 feet owned by N. F. Brown and Leighton McMurtrie, who, however, have refused several offers. The property secured by Beer & Goff adjoins the site of the \$150,000 Bridges block to be occupied by the Frevert-Bledsoe Furniture company and is opposite Marston's new department store and the Cecil hotel. On the next corner north in the same block, is being erected the J. M. Anderson \$105,000 hotel, the site being known as the Dr. Thomas Magee property. Beer & Goff do not contemplate making any improvements at this time, but intend leasing the ground floor store on a graduating scale.—San Diego, Cal. exc. (E. H. Beer, referred to above, is a native of Charlottetown who recently removed to California.)
