Snow Storm Raged In British Isles

The Worst for Years Causing Damage to Telegraph Lines and Shipping.

LONDON, April 28.—Following a period of perfect spring weather one of the worst storms in some time raged over the British Isles last night, covering the country with from four to six inches of snow. Telegraph and telephone lines suffered severely and communication is cut off in many directions from the city. Communication with the continent is cut off. This city received the brunt of the storm. Fifty thousand telephones were put out of service. Spring crops and young lambs suffered from the storm. Marine reports show that a few small ships were wrecked.

Kolchak's Forces Make Good Progress

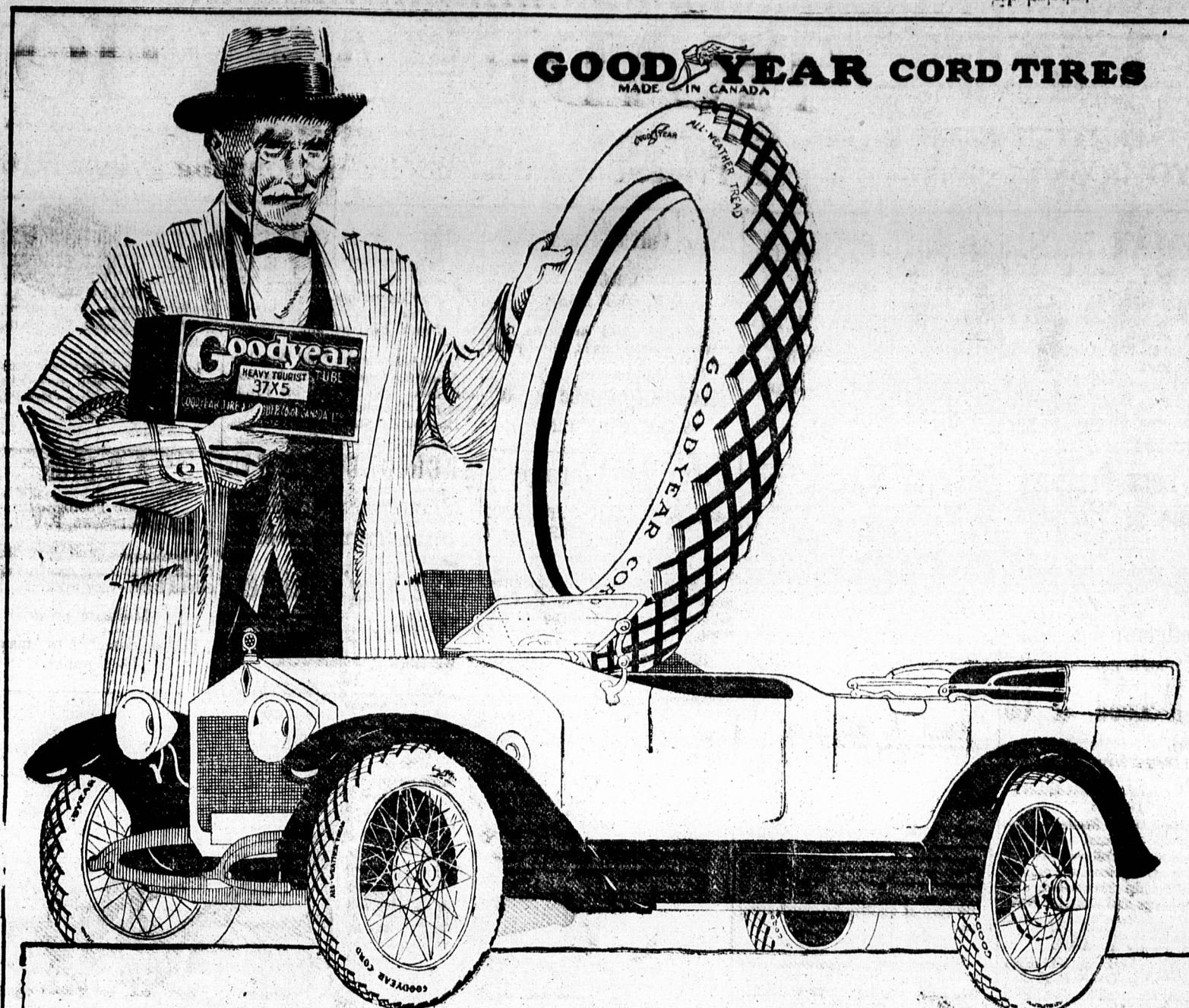
(Special to The Guardian.) PARIS, April 28.—Admiral Kolchak's troops have advanced along the Southern branch of the trans-Siberian Railroad in Eastern European Russia to Kinel, only forty miles east of Samara, according to despatches received by the Russian commissioners in Paris from Morsk, the capital of Admiral Kolchak's government. Prince Iroff and other members of the Russian Commission here believe that the movement westward will be rapid as spring advances, and they expect that the lower Volga valley will soon be under the control of the Kolchaks Government. It is also hoped the Omsk forces will soon capture Viatka, thus making it imperative that the Bolsheviks withdraw from the Archangel section as the railway running north from Viatka reaches the Dvina at Kotlas and would make communication easy between the allied forces in Northern Russia and those of the Omsk Government.

German Delegates Leave for Paris

(Special to The Guardian.) BERLIN, April 28.—German delegates to the peace conference will travel to Versailles on three special trains. The first was to leave Berlin Sunday and the last on Monday. It is expected that the peace terms will be handed to the German representatives on Tuesday evening. The Tagblatt says it is assumed in well-informed circles that the Italo-American incident will not influence negotiations at Versailles.

SPONGE IS MERELY A LOT OF CAPILLARY TUBES

A sponge will hold water because it has, on account of the plan on which it is grown, the power of capillary attraction. The sponge is made up of little hair-like tubes. If you take a glass tube, open at both ends, and immerse one end in a vessel of water, you will find that the water will rise in the tube to a level higher than the surface of the water in the vessel. The smaller the hole through the glass tube, the higher the water will rise. This is caused by the cohesion of the water against the inside surface of the hole in the tube, and causes a pull upward. The water is pulled up into the tube because the surface of the tube has a greater cohesive attraction for the water than for the air which was in it, and the air is forced out partly. Some liquids, such as mercury, will not rise in the same way, but are depressed in a glass tube, since they cannot adhere to glass. Mercury, however, will run or rise in a tin tube just as water in a glass tube, because it adheres to the tin.
