THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPH.

During the recent yacht races the United States naval authorities made a pretty exhaustive trial of the different systems of wireless telegraphy with a view to determine the practicability of one or other of them as a means of directing naval operations. An official report of these experiments has been made and shows a disappointing result. It was found that the operation of a number of instruments in the same field so interfered with each other that the signals became quite unintelligible. It would therefore be impossible to utilize wireless telegraphy in its present state for naval signalling.

It is hoped that the trouble from interference of cross currents may yet be obviated and many scientists and inventors are giving the matter their best attention, but they have not yet found a reliable solution. The electric impulse sent into the air tends, like sound, to spread in every direction, and the same confusion arises when a number of wireless electric instruments are working at different points within the same field as when many sounds are made at the same time within audible distance of each other. There can be no secrecy and there is in such case inevitable confusion. The wireless telegraph is, however, fairly reliable within limited distance when only one set of signals is being sent and received at the same time. Even this is subject to the danger of the signal being "picked up" by some one for whom it was not intended.

Arabi Pacha, who was banished to Ceylon after his unsuccessful attempt at revolution in Egypt in 1881, is now returning to his native land with a free pardon. At Suez he was interviewed by the correspondent of an English newspaper to whom he expressed in the warmest terms his admiration for British rule as he had seen it in Ceylon; and whatever else his eighteen years' exile in that island has done, it appears to have made him a staunch friend to Britain.

A number of the New England papers are discussing favorably the renewal of reciprocal trade relations with Canada. The interests and influences opposed to reciprocity are however probably too great to be overcome. The Gloucester fishermen, the coal barres and the lumber Kings will oppose free trade in natural products and the great manufacturing interests will also stand opposed. In the meantime Canada is doing very well. Never before had Canadian trade gone forward by leaps and bounds as it has since the days of the McKinley and Dingley tariffs. Our trade is now about two and a half times as great per head of our population as is that of the Republic. "Let the galled jade wince; our withers are unwrung."

A BUSY STATION IN SCOTLAND.

The busiest collecting station in Scotland is that at Eglinton street in Glasgow, on the Caledonian railway. At this depot 630 trains are dealt with daily. The average number of tickets collected each day is 15,000, and 29,000 on Saturdays.

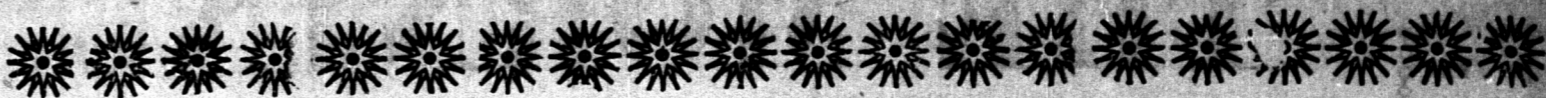

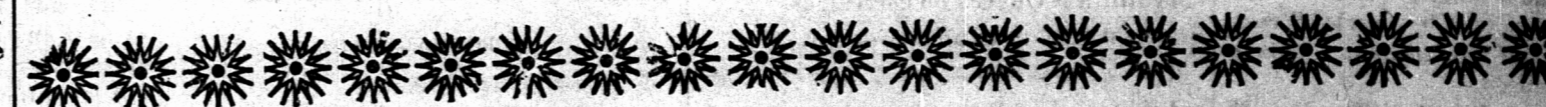
