#### FOLD NAPKINS THE NEAT WAY

Size of the table napkin and the position of its initial or monogram will have considerable influence on the manner of its folding. The simple square or the straight long and narrower fold, are always excellent form. The very large damask dinner napkin folded in four each way, makes a large square, as does the more modest-sized napkin, if it is folded in three; either one of these resulting squares, may be folded again in half or with two edges turned in if there is an initial in the centre of the square to be considered. A favorite fold for a small tea or luncheon napkin, be it hemstitched, embroidered or lace-trimmed is the triangle. This is an equally good fold when there is a corner medallion.

#### 5th. Dist. King's Conservative Convention

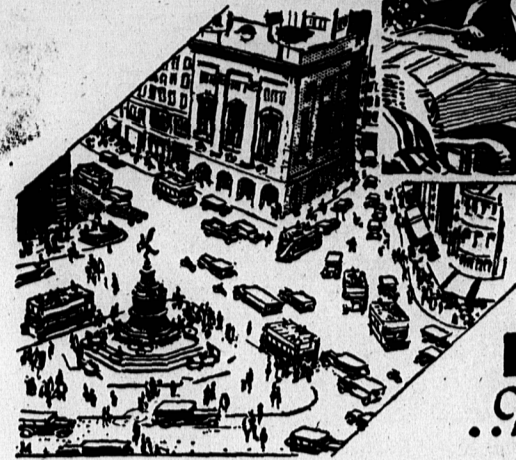

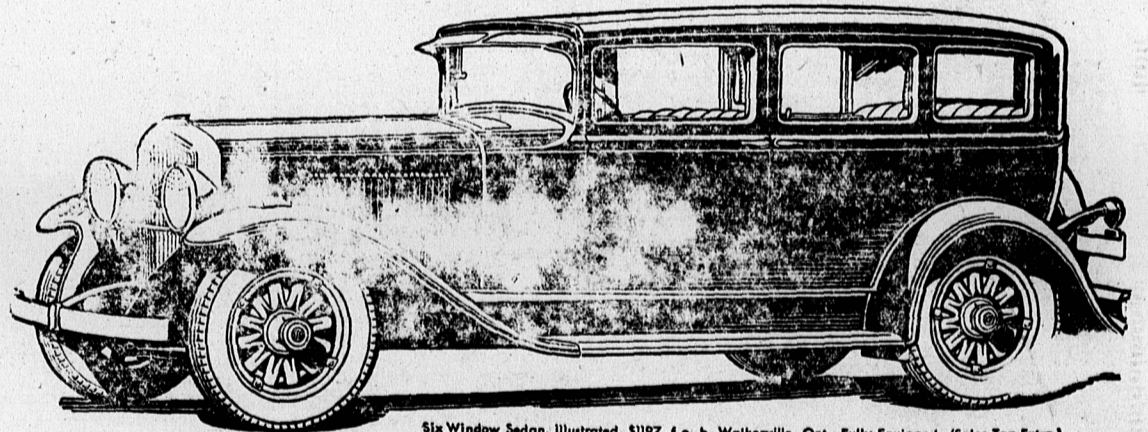

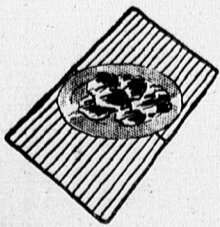
