CLOSING COTTON LETTER

(From F. B. McCurdy & Co's Private Wire.) NEW YORK—Price says: The cotton market lost yesterday's advance during today's trading although there was absolutely no change in the news and it looked as if the decline reflected nothing more than the fact that the timid shorts covered yesterday and that in the absence of aggressive bull support or outside business there was a consequent lack of demand today.

There were slight rallies from this level, but there was no improvement in the tone of the market, and the buying was chiefly for the account of early sellers. We can hardly expect any revival of general demand, or any aggressive bull support, around these levels of prices at any rate until after the issuance of the census figures. Sentiment was very much confused and while the average view still favors ultimately much higher prices, evidences of a short crop are not conclusive and the increasing movement is leading to a more cautious attitude so far as the bull side is concerned.

CLOSING STOCK LETTER

From F. B. McCurdy & Co's Private Wire.)

NEW YORK—Randolph says: The opening was active and weak, so much so as to cause considerable surprise in speculative circles as the overnight news was all of a favorable character and yesterday's close was so strong as to cause expectation of a resumption of the advance. Union Pacific was the feature, on large sales making a wide opening from 177 to 177 1/2 against a closing last night of 178 1/2, the selling movement continued actively during the first half hour and forced sharp declines all through the active list. At the lower levels support was put in and the market rallied fairly well. During the rest of the day trading was extremely dull, narrow and insignificant. As a whole, however, the tone was heavy and the active issues all closed showing net losses on the day which extended in the case of Union Pacific to about two points.

Money continued extremely easy, being influenced to a certain extent by the favorable showing made by the Bank of England.
