THE GUARDIAN regrets to hear of the death of Mr. John McLaughlin, brakeman on the Island Railway, which occurred at his home near Douglas Station Monday. The deceased was a brother of Dr. McLaughlin, of St. Peter's Bay, and was about 24 years of age. He was a young man of excellent character, and had many friends by whom his death will be mourned.

THE Y. M. L. A. lecture course in St. James Hall opened most auspiciously last evening with a full house and a capital lecture. Mr. A. A. Bartlett was the lecturer and his subject was "Glimpses of Papal Rome." His good diction and excellent descriptive power made an attractive subject very engaging as it was instructive. The lecture was illustrated with a series of stereoscopic views showing the notable edifices and palaces which adorn the Eternal City. It was on a regrettable that the electric light was at times too dim to bring out the full beauty of these views. The lecture was an hour and a half in length, was closely listened to throughout and was heartily applauded. The vote of thanks was moved by Mr. T. C. James and seconded by Rev. Mr. McLeod, of Orwell.

AMONG the most tastefully fitted drug stores in the city or indeed in the Maritime Provinces, are the new apartments of Messrs Johnson & Johnson, druggists, who have removed their down town business from the corner of Queen and Richmond streets to the western section of the new Prowse Block on North Side of Queen Square. The removal was rendered necessary by a greatly increased patronage and consequent lack of room. This difficulty is now obviated, the new store being 15 1/2 x 90 feet. The main store extends back 40 feet. To the right immediately within the door is a reception room neatly fitted. This room is for the accommodation of ladies when waiting for the filling of prescriptions or wishing to meet friends. It is a new feature in the Charlottetown drug business and will be greatly appreciated by lady customers. Adjoining the reception room is the soda fountain. The tincture shelving is also along the right hand side of the store, while the show cases and upright wall cases are to the left. In the rear of this apartment is a large bevel plate mirror which lends additional attractiveness to the interior. An ar way is on either side of the mirror, one opening into the office, the other into the prescription apartment which is specially fitted for the requirements of an extensive drug business. To the rear of this and separated from it by a glass partition is an apartment 35 feet long to be used as a laboratory and stock room. The store is finished throughout in antique ash with steel ceiling and hardwood floor. It is heated with hot water. The lighting will be from three three-jet reflectors from the ceiling and a four jet fector in the window. The large circular plate glass window, the fresh attractiveness of the interior and the brilliancy of the light combine to render this store ideal in its appearance.
