R. C. A. F. Boat Disappears;

VANCOUVER, Aug. 12 - (CP) - The former fishboat, B.C. Star, under charter to the Royal Canadian Air Force, has disappeared off the British Columbia coast with a crew of 15 R.C.A.F. personnel and it is feared that all have been lost. Next of kin have been notified and names will be issued shortly. Time of the disappearance of the vessel has not been disclosed, but it is believed to have been within the past two weeks. Last Sunday the skipper of the small British Columbia packers ship Tevo was asked by R.C.A.F. officers if he had seen any trace of the B.C. Star. He had not. The missing vessel was 57 feet long and it is said to have been under charter to the R.C.A.F. for the past year and a half.

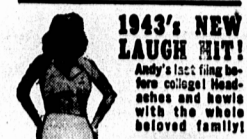

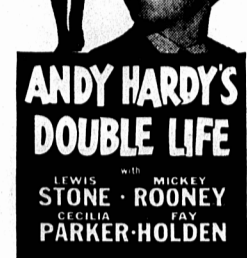

Well Known Local Man Dies Suddenly

Mr. Frank Macdonald, an employee in the Registry Office, Provincial Building, passed away suddenly at 12:30 yesterday.

The late Mr. Macdonald was just going out of the Provincial Building when he was stricken with a heart attack. Medical aid was immediately summoned but was of no avail.

The deceased was well known throughout the island. He was prominent football star of the old Abegweit teams and a veteran of the First World War, having served in France with the 5th Canadian Siege Battery. He was severely gassed in Arranieres.

He is survived by two children, Dominic and Phyllis; one brother, R. A. Macdonald, and two sisters, Mrs. James Fraser and Miss Margaret Macdonald, both of Charlottetown.

The remains are resting at Frank Hennessy's Undertaking Parlor from where the funeral will take place on Saturday morning at 8:45 to the Church of the Most Holy Redeemer thence to the Roman Catholic Cemetery.

Howe Urges Coal Economy

OTTAWA, Aug. 12 - (CP) - A means of conserving coal, Munitions Minister Howe appealed tonight to business building owners to cut out of at once the supply of hot water to their tenants.

"Except for hospitals, clinics, and buildings containing doctors or dentists offices, barbers, or other occupants who must have hot water to carry on their vocation, and

except for factories and warehouses where the employees must frequently wash, there are very few business buildings which require hot water," Mr. Howe said in a statement.

"Rather than issue a mandatory order, the government prefers to leave it to the patriotism of building owners to cease supplying hot water where it is not absolutely essential."

Mr. Howe said he expected building owners to comply with the request during the summertime for the duration of the war.
