CHICAGO, Dec. 17 (AP)—Grain futures prices generally were for whatever influences were doing business at the moment.
WINNIPEG, Dec. 17 (CP)—Eye futures prices on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today showed independent strength with local commission houses and occasional buying for American account finding offerings light, dealings were inactive.
TORONTO, Dec. 17 (CP)—Moderate pre-holiday selling put the market back for stable losses today. The gold lead decline with an index loss of 1.38 while the Base Metals dropped .30 and the Western Oils .28.
MONTREAL, Dec. 17 (CP)—Security prices moved to low levels on average parading business on Wall Street today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market. The list boarded was fairly broad but volume was not heavy.
 Some strength was displayed by "blue chips" among utilities, the preferred of Calgary power, Anglo-Telephone, International Power and Southern Canada Power all working higher.
 Trading box score: Total sales, 143,200 shares; mines 76,400; industrials 68,800; stocks higher 41; lower 102; unchanged 65.
NEW YORK, Dec. 17 (AP)—Heavy cashing of profits pulled the props from under the Stock Market today and leaders dropped 1 to 7 points in the sharpest setback for nearly two years.
 Brokers generally attributed the tumble partly to "tipsters" who predicted a release and to the simultaneous move of speculators to realize gains under the 25 cent capital tax law on the idea this important might be boosted if holding terms lengthened in 1944 as a step against inflation.
 While assorted issues closed a shade above their lows, many finished at bottom figures. Transfers of 1,980,000 shares were compared with 1,130,000 Friday. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 1.8 points, widest downturn since April 9, 1943.
