**THE POTATO TIE-UP**—Up to yesterday the car ferry steamer at Pictou had not discharged all the large cargo which she conveyed from Charlottetown on Friday last. Pictou advisers that there is no use sending potatoes there until the steamer is emptied, as the potatoes have to go forward in refrigerator cars for which they are waiting. There are thirty-seven cars of potatoes waiting in the railway yard at Charlottetown, which are in fairly good shape. They are being protected as well as can be with bags while some of the owners are putting oil stoves in the cars. The wharf at Pictou is lined with potato-laden schooners which are waiting for cars to forward them to their destinations.
