The Scott Act In Kings.

SIR.—In your last issue of the Weekly GUARDIAN I notice a letter from the pen of Wm Keenan, who does not want prohibition. Knowing him we do not wonder at this. But he has misrepresented the state of affairs at Montague in regard to Scott Act enforcement. When the present prosecutor was appointed he found seven places at Montague and as many at Georgetown where liquor could be obtained. He has succeeded by the assistance of the temperance people (less Keenan) in closing out all those places at Montague and Georgetown besides many others with one exception, namely Eliza Campbell of Montague. The prosecutor has been forced to allow three cases against said party to be dismissed for want of evidence.

For the last three years the prosecutor has ran about one hundred and seventy cases and has obtained over one hundred convictions. More than that, he is engaged in prosecuting second offences and he expects, without the assistance of Mr. Keenan, who is a chronic grumbler, to clear Montague of the one remaining place where liquor is sold.

Prosecutor Bears will be very glad to receive by mail or otherwise any evidence that will lead to the conviction of any rumrunner in Kings county. The informant must give his name to show that it is a bonafide case. Let all temperance workers show their earnestness by their actions and not be for ever finding fault with the prosecutor. Mr. Keenan has not yet walked with the footmen and knows nothing about running with horses.

\$100 for playthings.

SIR.—Sir John A. Macdonald gets credit for saying that he cared not a fig for one who only supported him while in the right; it was when doing wrong he needed assistance and the man who thus stood stubbornly by him was the one he wanted to reward when dispensing the spoils. I am a government supporter, but not of the variety that sees nothing wrong in his party. I hope always to have greater regard for truth, honor and justice than for any combination of men. I am moved to write in this strain owing to a sentence contained in a despatch dated Ottawa April 10 running as follows: "The auditor-general took exception to an expenditure of \$100 for articles of amusement for men of the Yukon contingent such as foot ball, base ball, quitois, cribbage-boards, playing cards etc. In reply the minister said he considered it prudent to make some expenditure for the comfort of the men." I ask the reader to note the words "prudent" and "comfort" and draw his conclusions as to their application. The men for whose amusement the \$100 were spent receive excellent pay

and can well afford to procure playing cards if they feel so inclined; financially they are in a much better position than three-fourths of the Dominion tax-payers who foot the bills. From all accounts there is too much card-playing at the Yukon territory without government supplying the tools gratis, one hundred dollars may appear insignificant, but why should it be wasted? The man who considers it "prudent" to spend \$100 on toys for grown men will be equally judicious in other respects. The government already threw away a quarter million on the plebiscite business and it would be in good form to be only extravagant when occasion required. An insignificant hurt on the finger often gives more annoyance than a serious wound, so with the expenditure of \$100 for toys to people who are well paid; such an act of idiotic folly is an insult to the long-suffering tax-payers. Party scales are being gradually removed and fewer people will bear with wrong because done by their party, than ten years ago.
