Price Control Questions And Answers

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the War Times Prices and Trade Board.

Q. Can a dealer insist that when you buy fruit you must make an additional purchase?

A. No, this is illegal and a firm of fruit dealers in Montreal was fined \$1,500 for requiring a purchase of other goods in selling grapes and other fruit.

Q. I had my dinner in a restaurant and when I asked for an order of butter they refused to give it to me. Is this right?

A. Yes. No second orders of butter, coffee or tea are allowed.

Q. I rent two furnished rooms in my home and do not think I receive sufficient rental for them. Is it legal for me to raise the rent?

A. No, it is not legal for you to raise the rent without permission of the War Time Prices and Trade Board.

Q. I must apply to the Rentals Administration. Wartime Prices and Trade Board, for the proper forms on which to make such an application. When the forms are returned an appraiser will inspect the property and make a decision as to the rental which you may charge.

MOTHERS NEEDED IN HOMES

Juvenile Delinquency Flourishes When No One There To Greet Children After School

I am getting sick and tired of hearing so much about juvenile delinquency and reading articles, written by stary-eyed theorists, about turning young hoodlums into angels by giving them playgrounds, child centers and their own movies and dance halls, when everybody really knows that the one and only solution of the problem is for mothers to stay at home and be on their jobs.

Of course, it wouldn't hurt any for fathers to take a hand in rearing their children and go to the mat with Junior when, and if, the occasion demanded, and show him which was the better man; but the real reformation has to be worked by a mother with a stiff backbone and a good, strong right arm, who stays on the premises and takes no stock in the theory that youngsters can be managed by remote control.

Now the stork has been in business for a long time. It has delivered millions of bundles from Heaven to all sorts and conditions of people, and the contents of these packages have been much of a mixed-up, plastic little creatures ready to take any impression. Babies still come the same way. The pattern for them has not altered. Yet in the past we had no juvenile delinquency problem. An occasional bad boy or a wayward girl was a rare figure in a community, but now we lie awake at night wondering what to do about the bands of youthful criminals who are old in sin before they are in years.

BLAME COMES TO OUR OWN HOMES

We can't lay the blame for this condition of affairs on society as a whole, or the general unrest of the times, or the shifting of modern ideals. It comes right down to our own individual homes, to our own heartstones that are cold because there is nobody in them to tend the fires and keep them burning.

It is the absentee mothers who are never at home when their children come from school who send their youngsters out on the street to learn its bitter wisdom, to make its contacts, and to acquire its morals and its manners. Mother has to be in a house to turn it into a home that children want to stay in. And if Mother isn't there and there is no one to welcome them, or listen to their stories of what they have been doing, or to be glad to see them they start out on the road that only too often leads to the jail or the brothel.

Mother has to be always on the spot. Always available. Always ready to comfort to cheer, to guide her children if she is to have any influence in shaping their lives and making them the sort of men and women she wants them to be. And it is a task she cannot delegate to any hireling, nor can she trust it to luck. The mothers who do not know where their children are when they are out of school, what they are doing, or with whom they are associating are the recruiting agents for the juvenile delinquent bands.

I thought as I looked from my window this morning, that wherever one turns, in the old times, there seems to be strife. There were great blocks of homemade soap and as I said before, the women in the family. At Alderlea we have a hand-washing machine—hand-powered—and a wringer of sorts. There's a small pump in the porch, an abundance of wood and the old Ranee to do her part. I might also say, in enumerating my blessings or riches, I am the very proud possessor of a large, new, enamel cooking pot.

"Goodness!" replied the modern daughter, "don't you ever read the papers?"

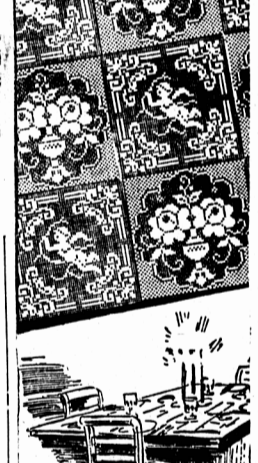

THE COOK'S CORNER

A STEAMED CARROT, RAISIN AND POTATO PUDDING

One cup sugar, 1 cup flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 cup finely grated carrot, 1 cup grated raw potato, 1 cup each curants and raisins (or 2 cups raisins, and juice and grated rind 1 lemon. Mix and sift sugar, flour, baking powder, salt and soda. Add remaining ingredients, and mix thoroughly. Turn into buttered large mould or buttered one-half pound baking powder tins, cover, and steam 2 hours. Serve with hard sauce or Fanny Sauce.

CHICKEN HOLLANDAISE

Three tablespoons butter or cooking oil, 2 teaspoons grated onion, 4 tablespoons cornstarch, 2 cups chicken stock, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 1 cup finely chopped celery, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon paprika, 2 cups to 2 1/2 cups cold chicken cut in 1/2-inch cubes, yolks of 2 hard-cooked eggs. Cook butter and onion gently for 5 minutes, add cornstarch and the stock, mix thoroughly. Add lemon juice, salt, paprika and chicken; when heated through, add the hard-cooked egg
