Garcia Puts Title On Line

NEW YORK, May 22—(AP)—For the third time since he won it last October, Federico Garcia lays his world's middleweight title (New York-California) on the line tomorrow night in a 15-round bout with Ken Overlin of Washington in Madison Square Garden. Out of the scrap may come two outdoor shows. There is talk of matching the winner with light-heavyweight champion Billy Conn in one of the New York baseball parks during the summer. Also, there is a possibility that the victor may get a shot at Al Hank of Seattle, recognized as middleweight king by the National Boxing Association. Odds are shortening on Garcia who was a 5-13 favorite earlier in the week. There is plenty of Overlin money around at this price and it may be the Filipino will be backed down to 1-2 at ringside. Garcia won his crown from Fred Axel in last October. Overlin, rated one of the improved boxers in the game, has been beaten only once in 20 starts in the last two years.

INDIANAPOLIS, May 22—(AP)—Hundred race drivers watched the weather today as 11 cars stood in the pits of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway waiting to qualify for the Memorial Day 500-mile race. Spring showers in mid-afternoon put a damper on action of the first day set aside for time trials on the 2.5-mile oval. Twenty-one of the 33 places in the starting lineup still are open. To qualify, a car must go 10 m.p.h. at an average of at least 115 miles an hour, but only the 33 fastest will compete.
