# THE QUEBEC ANNIVERSARY

## It is Going To Be One of The Greatest Celebrations In The History of Canada

HALIFAX, March 35.—Not in the history of Canada has there been any matter upon which there has been such an absolute unanimity of sentiment, so spontaneous and so all-prevailing an enthusiasm, as upon the question of celebrating the three-hundredth anniversary of the settlement of Quebec and the founding of the Canadian nation. The progress already made in the preparations is such that there can no longer be any doubt not only that the celebration will be one worthy of the Dominion, but that it will offer to the world a spectacle of pomp and pageantry unparalleled in modern history.

It will do more than that. It will bring into strong relief, for all the world to admire, the solidarity of Canada and its people. It will exhibit the spectacles of the two predominant races of the nation—races which still retain each its own religion—joining hands on the common ground of patriotism and national unity in doing honor to the memory of the great historic figures which both peoples gave to Canada in the early days of the nation. Such a commemoration will be an inspiration to the other lands within the Empire. It will be an inspiration also to the Canadian people themselves. Already aze in Canada its good effect is apparent, for since the tercentenary was mooted, the people are being educated as never before in their common heritage.

Since the announcement was made that the Prince of Wales is coming in state to represent the King at the celebration, there has been a marked increase in general enthusiasm. The date on which His Royal Highness will arrive has made it necessary to hasten the events by at least two weeks. Instead of the commemoration taking place in August it has now been fixed to start on July 20, and to last for a fortnight. The Prince will sail as an Admiral of the fleet on the battleship 'Dominion,' and he will be accompanied by four other warships, and a distinguished staff. In addition to this fleet, there will be detachments from the fleet of France, the United States and in fact that nearly all the great powers, each of whom will send delegations of statesmen to represent them at the great national celebration. That in addition to these accredited representatives, there will be a great influx of visitors from all parts of the world to witness the historic scenes of the commemoration, is already a certainty, for applications for accommodation are pouring in from all parts of the world.

The Prince is due to arrive on July 22, and he will depart on July 29. His headquarters during his stay will be the Chateau Frontenac, and some idea of the suite that he will bring with him may be gauged from the fact that he has engaged no fewer than forty-five rooms at the hotel. The applications for the hotel are already far in excess of the number that can possibly be accommodated, and it is quite evident that one of the most difficult problems of all in connection with the tercentenary will be that of providing housing and feeding for the great throngs of people who will visit the city. A special committee is now grappling with the problem. Already the erection has begun of two gigantic hotels, each capable of accommodating five thousand guests for the occasion, and many smaller projects of a similar nature are being developed. In addition every boarding and lodging house in the city is being canvassed, and accurate returns prepared, so that guests can be accommodated with the least possible amount of inconvenience.

Frank Lascelles, who has been so successful in conducting historic pageants in England, is busy in planning the features of the Tercentenary pageantry. One of these features will represent the coming of Champlain, and the first simple but momentous scenes that were enacted.

## CLERK LIVED LIKE A MILLIONAIRE

### Employee With \$500 Florist Bill Arrested on Charge of Stealing \$42,000

TORONTO, March 30.—At Athlone, a little place in Simcoe County, about a mile and a half west of Tottenham, Douglas B. Findlay, aged twenty, was yesterday arrested for the alleged theft of about \$42,000 from the firm of McDonald & Mabee, wholesale cattle dealers.

Findlay was the book-keeper for the firm for over two years. About six weeks ago the firm became suspicious that something was wrong. An accountant was put upon the books, and it was then discovered that there was a serious shortage which grew and grew as the investigation proceeded. The accounts, apparently, had been ingeniously balanced, large amounts being entered which the firm believe they are not owed.

Recently it was noticed by the heads of the firm that the young fellow had latched onto the extra allowance which his income would not justify. He bought flowers at fifteen dollars a dozen and dressed like a Beau Brummel. He wore diamond rings worth hundreds of dollars. When D. McDonald saw a large diamond ring on his finger at the office and asked him how he could afford such luxuries Findlay told him that he was engaged to a millionaire's daughter and his father-in-law was backing him. As he was often seen about with a young lady and the explanation of where he got his money was considered good. He gave the young lady he was supposed to be engaged to the most costly gifts, including valuable diamond rings. His bill for flowers at one well-known firm is about \$500.

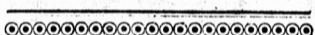
