The group which will come by boat to North Sydney will be welcomed by the Island Scout Association at Wood Islands. The Scouts will bring their supplies locally but will get along their own tents and utensils. It is expected they will visit places of historic interest while here.

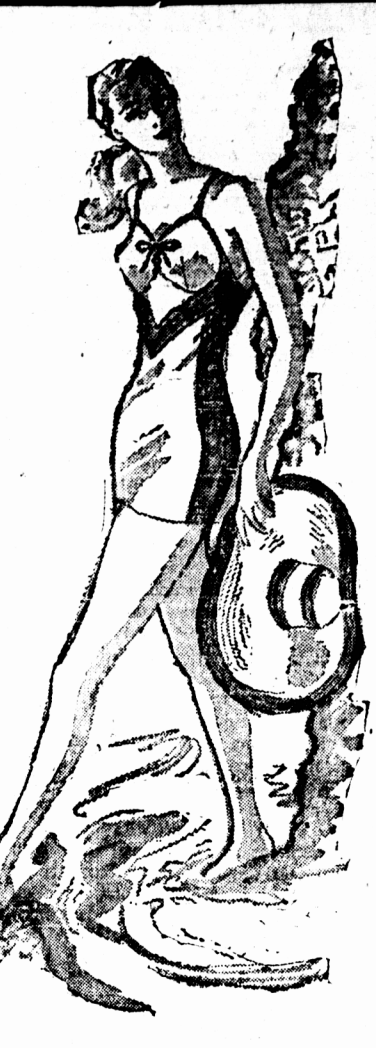
