### MAGDALEN ISLANDS NEED SUPPLIES FOR THIS WINTER

HALIFAX, Dec. 20.—P. F. Martin, M. P., held a conference this afternoon with representatives of the Magdalen

Islands regarding the transportation of much-needed supplies to the islands before the ice sets in. The Halifax board of trade and the people of the islands have made strenuous efforts to secure a steamer from the government for the purpose but have met with no success, the marine department informing them that no ship is available. The island men now in Halifax say that there are 1,700 barrels of flour and large quantity of fishing gear at Pictou awaiting shipment to the islands and if these supplies are not delivered it will be a disaster to the community which will be seriously affected this winter and next spring. They say that there are no supplies of gasoline on the island and that power fishing boats will consequently be unable to operate next spring if the shipment is not made. They say, too, that there is no kerosene oil in the islands' stores and that the people will have no proper lights in their homes if the supplies are not delivered.
