Sir:—In our letter of the 2nd inst., we took exception to the Board of Trade action in being the medium through which Mr. Hartman came here to address a meeting relative to the establishment of a potato flour mill in this Province, without first consulting the Island starch interests.

Mr. Carter's reply in the morning, Mr. Gardner in defence of the Board of Trade action, does not alter the facts of the situation, and does not place the Board of Trade in any better light with the Island starch manufacturers. We regret that the Board's action is so low, that the President could not properly advertise the meeting, so as to enable starch companies representatives, outside of the city to be present.

As regards Mr. Carter's contention that the starch interests were well represented at the meeting, we beg to differ as there was only one representative at the meeting who was in touch with the business Mr. W. H. Prowse is not now actively engaged in the starch business, and Capt Full has been overseas for the past two or four years. Mr. Carter's reference to our Company not being members of the Board of Trade, and helping to promote new industries, we think probably some of our shareholders have done as much to assist local industry than many active members of the Board of Trade have done, but we hope the Board of Trade will continue their activities. 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HINTS FOR The Motorist

THE OBSCURED WINDSHIELD

The Misty Windshield Is As Bad As A Blind Driver

The dangers involved in driving in rain, fog or snow, with a clouded windshield, are seldom fully realized and it behooves every motorist to guard against them. "Rain-visibility" shields are excellent, but do not conform perfectly to operators of different conditions, the extreme weather conditions, the rain-visibility feature involves such discomfort that it is not made use of. The application of the glass of liquids or other preparations, designed to spread the moisture into a uniform film instead of permitting it to collect in lens like drops are of considerable temporary value but frequently their use is neglected or delayed too long. Nevertheless it is well to carry a bottle of liquid or one of the chemically prepared windshield cloths for use in case the shield has to be closed in extremely violent storms. In misty weather or light rain, the front application of glycerine to a transparent film over it, with which the condensed moisture mixes and upon which drops do not form to distort vision. A piece of flannel, saturated with glycerine, can be carried and by rubbing this over the shield, sufficient liquid is left upon the glass to suffice for some little time. Repeated wiping or scraping away of the collected water drops of snow is however the most effective way of maintaining "good visibility," but this is an awkward proceeding when only a cloth and the operator's hands are available.

However, windshield-cleaners of various kinds are on the market, which are permanently fixed in place and thus available at all times by means of which a area of the glass, in the line of sight, can be scraped clear, by operating a handle within easy reach of the operator.
