SUCCESSFUL SALE.—Mr. Ben. Carter, Charlottetown, returned on Thursday night by the Empress from Amherst where he conducted a sale of Clydesdale fillies as previously announced. The fillies were of the very best type and two year olds sold at from \$230 to \$410 each, one team alone selling as high as \$810. On that occasion, Mr. Carter exceeded his reputation as an auctioneer, as is shown by the fact that he was chosen from among all the auctioneers in the Maritime Provinces. He goes this morning to North River, where he will conduct the sale of Mr. C. E. Ridd.

ROUGH TRIP.—A passage which can easily be called the roughest of the season, was made in the storm on Thursday night by the S. S. Empress from Pt. Du Chene to Summerside. All the way over the steamer rocked, and at times was leaning almost on her side. The waves dashed high and the fog horn was kept continually blowing. Almost every passenger was seasick and the ladies all retired to the steamer's hold, where the action of the waves was not felt to such a great extent. Captain Cameron and his able staff did all in their power to make the trip comfortable and the Captain is to be heartily congratulated in bringing his ship safely to port through such a blizzard.

ISLAND POULTRY WINNERS AT AMHERST—Prince Edward Island poultrymen, as usual carried off most of the prizes in the classes in which they competed at the Amherst Winter Fair just closed. Amherst had about 3,200 entries, a show that compared advantageously with any held in America. Some idea of the vast number of birds and exhibitors can be had from the following taken from the official catalogue—Buff Oringtons and White Wyandottes had the largest entries—over 100 birds in each class, shown by over 35 exhibitors; Barred Rocks had 13 exhibitors; White Rocks, 10 exhibitors; White Orpington, 11 exhibitors; White Leghorns, 12 exhibitors; and Brown Leghorns, 13 exhibitors; other classes ranging from 9 to 4 exhibitors. There were altogether 391 exhibitors. The following are the prizes. Islanders won: Spanish—1st pullet, L. A. Hassard, Orpington—1 and 2 cock; 3 hen; 1 and 3rd, pullet, C. P. Thorne; 3rd Cockerel, L. Hassard; 5th, Thorne. Buff Rocks—1st Cockerel, 2nd Pullet, Hassard; 1 cock, 2, and 3 hen, L. Foster; R. I. Red—4th pullet, Hassard. White Rocks—1st, Cock; 2 hen; 3rd cockerel; 3 pullet; 1st pen, A. Boswell. S. S. Hamburg, 1, 2, cock; 1, 2, hen; 1, 2 pullet; 1, 2 cockerel, John Tweedy. G. P. Hamburg—1, 2, cock; 2, hen; 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, pullet; 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, Cockerel, Henry Foswell. Barred Rocks—6 cock, 1, hen; 2, pullet, 4 cockerel, and 2nd pen, L. H. D. Foster. Buff Rock—1 pen, Foster. Spring Park Poultry Yards made a clean sweep in Bantams, winning 11 firsts, 2 seconds and one third. There were also many prizes taken in utility classes and in ducks, geese and turkeys by Messrs. Boswell, Calbeck, Foster and Spring Park P. Yards. The fact that so many prizes were won by Island breeders at a show like the fair at Amherst goes to show what high class stock is raised in this island.

CROWN ROAST OF PORK.
Tie a dozen pork chops so as to form a crown, with the ribs trimmed free of meat, and cut the same length. Fill the centre of the crown with some small onions, or with sausage meat mixed with one-third its quantity of bread-crumbs. Put the roast in a dipping pan with a cupful of hot water, and roast till thoroughly done, at least three hours, basting it frequently with the drippings.
