HERST SCORES A BIG VICTORY

Capturing Chicago Democratic Delegation

Carter Harrison's Faction Defeated - Train Runs Into Burning Bridge and 25 are Seriously Injured.

It resulted in a serious injury to twenty-five but no one was killed.

HERST SCORED A VICTORY.

CHICAGO, May 3-(Special)-William R. Hearst today scored a victory in the Democratic primaries over the faction under Carter Harrison, which heretofore has been the dominant power in Cook County.

HOW DELEGATION STANDS. Hearst scored 227 delegates; Harrison 195, John Hopkins 10, and unattached 84 to control the Cook County machinery at stake.

DEAD BODY FOUND BURIED IN SAND

The Remains of an Infant Discovered by Fishermen at Blooming Point, Tracadie.

Attorney General Peters was notified yesterday that the body of an infant was found buried in the sand at Blooming Point, Tracadie, Saturday, and at the inquest held by Dr. Tombs in Afton Road schoolhouse on Monday, the jury arrived at the following verdict.

The woman who is about 40 years of age had been employed as cook at the factory of S. C. Clark near where the discovery was made.

A warrant has been issued for the woman who is still at Blooming Point.

Although the roads are still in a very bad condition, yet a fairly large number of farmers and their wives attended the market yesterday.

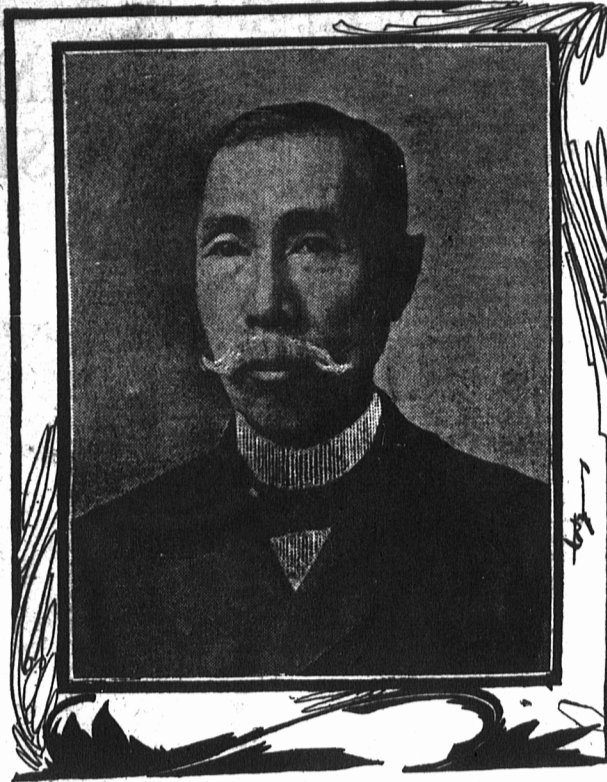
Oats are dull and buyers are not anxious to advance prices over 34 cts for black and 33 cts for white.

ADMIRAL TOGO AGAIN ATTEMPTS

To Block up Port Arthur But Fails - The Russian Force in Late Battles - The Czar's Grief - Captured Guns Had Breach Blocks Removed - Russian Losses Uncertain but Heavy.

LONDON, May 3-(Special)-Vice Admiral Togo has made another attempt to block up Port Arthur.

REPORT OF JAPANESE REVERSE.

Viceroy Alexieff has reported officially that the Japanese sent eight fire ships on Monday to block up the harbor entrance, but they were all sunk by the Russian torpedo boats.

9000 RUSSIANS ENGAGED.

According to Russian advices there were only about 9000 Russians actually engaged in the conflict at Kiu Lien Cheng on Sunday, and along the Latzaveva there were stationed two regiments of Siberian riflemen of three thousand each.

RUSSIANS WERE SURPRISED.

The Czar is said to be greatly grieved

over the losses on the Yalu River and also said that General Kuropatkin did not contemplate such a resistance to the Japanese advance, the Russian general having specific orders to avoid anything like a general engagement.

CAPTURED GUNS WORTHLESS.

The only consolation for the Russians in the loss of their guns is the fact that they are worthless without their breach blocks.

LOSSES NOT KNOWN.

No official news has yet been received as to the extent of the Russian losses, but it is known that they were forced to retreat. A large quantity of ammunition was captured, also a number of officers and men.

HOW TO TREAT MICE-GIRDLED TREES.

SIR: - Advice from all over the Island indicate the serious nature of the girdling done by the mice under the deep snow during the past winter. Indeed, the same complaints come from all over Canada.

If the tree girdled by mice is only one or two years old, it will be better to replant. If older, "bridging" the wound by means of sections of last year's growth may be resorted to.
