WARNING TO AUTOISTS—What might have been a serious accident happened at Falconwood Monday evening when a car driven at a reckless rate of speed ran off the driveway and collided with a stump, seriously damaging the car. The occupants got off with a few bruises. The Medical Superintendent and the Superintendent of the farm have decided for the safety of the patients and all concerned, that automobiles going at a higher rate of speed than ten miles an hour on Falconwood driveway will be prosecuted and prohibited from going on the grounds at all. They have also decided that cars will not be allowed on the grounds after 7 o'clock p. m. except on business, as they excite the patients and also because it is not deemed advisable that these grounds should be used as a pleasure resort. Automobiles have been known to be on these grounds as late as midnight, a cause of serious disturbance to the patients. Notices to this effect will be posted on the Falconwood roads and stringent measures will be adopted to prevent any abuses.

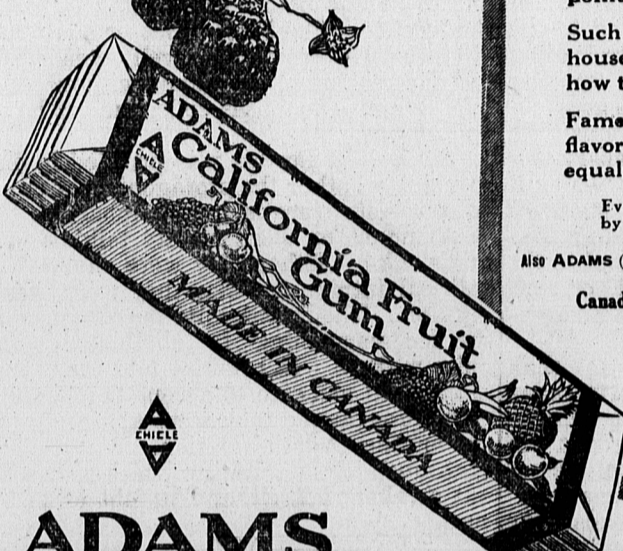
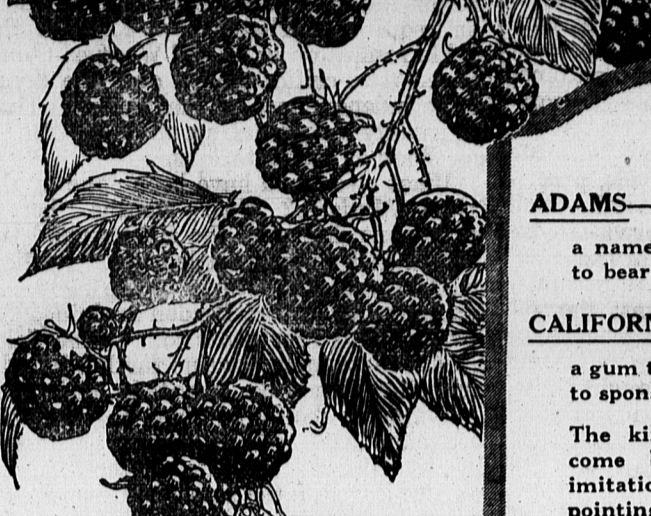

SCHOOL MEETINGS

Sir,—Your article on the importance of the annual school meetings is very timely. It appears that any further increase of the salaries of our teachers must come from the School Districts. Judging by the condition of our Provincial finances it is hopeless to expect further support from the Provincial Treasury. In fact it looks more like a necessity to lessen that support rather than increase it. To provide funds from which the Government could pay more to the teachers increased taxes would have to be imposed, a policy no party seems willing to adopt at present. The situation appears to be entirely in the control of the School Districts. They have the necessary machinery to raise the funds; no new legislation is required as would be for the Government before increasing the taxes. All the Districts have to do is vote the

amounts necessary from year to year. The taxpayers are the same people who pay to the Government or the school, then why not leave the matter of further school support entirely with the Districts? Some Districts may do themselves an injustice for a time but later they will see the wisdom of raising the amounts required to maintain government schools. When our ratepayers rise to the occasion generally and provide for the support of good schools we may then lay claim to having the true spirit of democracy, but not till then. We are moving that way, slowly it is true, nevertheless we are moving, and this year we should at least double the District support.
