### ROOSEVELT AND PARKER.

The Democratic National Convention having unanimously accepted Judge Parker as its standard bearer, he and Theodore Roosevelt will lead the opposing political hosts to battle in November next. At the last presidential contest in 1900 nearly 14,000,000 (actually 13,967,380) votes were cast. Of these McKinley received more than half, or 7,217,810. For Bryan the popular vote was 6,357,836, or 859,984 less than his successful opponent. Nearly 200,000 votes were scattered among other candidates. There seems little reason to doubt that the Republican party is still in the majority in the nation. Of the two candidates Roosevelt is the more widely known and on the whole the more attractive personality. He has been much the more conspicuous for years past. He has held office during a period of prosperity. The nation loves a soldier candidate. His party being in power is in his favor. We conclude that the chances are greatly in Roosevelt's favor, but elections, like horse races are still proverbially uncertain.

It is but a short time since the anti-dumping clause of the tariff went into operation, but it is affirmed that the American manufacturer has already found a way to evade its provisions and is dumping boots and shoes in very much the old way. It is said the anti-dumping clause will have to be amended before it will work effectively.

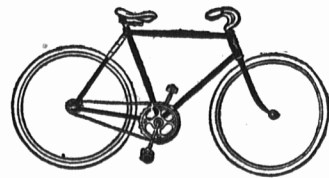
