MR. H. E. J. LEWIS.

In the passing of Mr. H. E. J. Lewis of Charlottetown Royalty, which occurred on January 6th last, this community has lost one of its most interesting and intelligent citizens. The late Mr. Lewis immigrated to this province from England in 1872 and settled in York with his wife and family. Here he resided for twenty years being one of the most successful farmers in this thriving community. Removing to Charlottetown Royalty he made a home for himself which, with its well kept garden, has been and still is admired by visitors and sightseers as well as enjoyed by the many friends who delighted to meet its genial and companionable owner. In early life Mr. Lewis who was a splendid type of the old English gentleman, joined the navy where he rose to the position of Captain. The traditions of the sea clung to him through his later years and he delighted to recount the adventures and exploits of his sea faring days. For the past fortyseven years he kept a diary of the weather, a veritable seaman's "log", which his friends delighted to scan with him and make comparisons with the weather conditions in the

passing years. There are left to cherish the memory of a loving and much loved father, one daughter Mrs. Susan McLean, Spokane, Washington, and one son, Mr. Herbert

Lewis, on the old homestead, York. A daughter, Mrs. Bruce Leff, passed away a few years ago. His wife predeceased him by thirtytwo years.
