**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**LONDON, Nov. 21 — (CP-Reuters)**—The latest war news again stimulated sentiment but business was rather on the quiet side on the Stock Market today, although the undertone was generally firm.

**WINNIPEG, Nov. 21 — (CP)**—Additional sales of Canadian wheat to the United Kingdom reported today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange lifted the two-day total to 7,000,000 bushels.

**NEW YORK, Nov. 21 — (AP)**—The Stock Market's recovery move was extended selectively today as one of the best average advances for more than two months with rails and industrials adding traditions to a point or so, on expanded volume.

**CHICAGO, Nov. 21 — (AP)**—Grain prices were irregular in the futures market today, advancing during the early part of the session only to decline under the pressure of profit taking just before the close. The strength of corn, wheat and the market was weakened most of the session.

**TORONTO, Nov. 21 — (CP)**—The Stock Market improved throughout the day today, led by the golds, featuring the Yellowknife issues.

A report that the Giant Yellowknife property had produced a dull core showing rich ore for an unusual length started early buying in Giant and the price touched 85 before settling back to 80 for a net gain of 35 cents. Turnover in the stock market was heavy. The market advanced 40 cents to 5.90 and Bear exploration gained 19 cents to close at 1.75 after touching 1.80. Trade in Bear totalled 55,000 shares. Bear is a heavy holder of Giant Stock. Consensus of analysts puts the price at 1.18 and Nexus 5 cents to 1.20.

**TWENTY-SIX BABIES FLY TO NEW HOME**

Ranging in age from six weeks to five months, all take flying in their stride.

 Flight is made from Quebec City to Chicoutimi without incident. First time in Canada's air history plane has been used as "flying perambulator."



Canadian flying men have moved a lot of strange cargoes both at home and abroad in the last several years, but when a Quebec Airways Boeing took off from Quebec City Airport the other day, bound for Chicoutimi, it carried one of the strangest loads of all—26 babies, not one of them over five months old.

The infants were being transferred from La Creche Saint-Vincent-de-Paul in Quebec to Chicoutimi—a long train ride, but only an hour away by air. L'Abbe Germain, priest in charge of the orphanage, contacted officials of Quebec Airways, a Canadian Pacific Air Lines subsidiary, with the result that the babies flew, and all in one plane-load. Ordinarily, the aircraft carries ten passengers and a crew of three. But with Sister Coeur Immaculee and Sister Marie de la Reparation, who were also making their first airplane flight, the total number of souls aboard was thirty-one. Even so, with each baby weighing an average of ten pounds, it was a far lighter load than customary. Special three-place cribs, made of plywood, were built so that each boy would fit into one seat in the airplane. Wrapped snugly in baby blankets, and strapped in both boxes and seats, even the roughest of air could not have tossed the tiny infants out. And as it turned out, there wasn't even one bump on the entire trip.

Bachelor Captain Art Leach, pilot of the plane, didn't have much to say: "They were squealing when I went forward before take-off, and they were squealing after I landed," he announced grumpily.

Said First Officer Gordon Alexander: "I didn't hear a thing. Had the ear-phones on all the time." Then musingly, "Seems to me static was a little worse than usual, though."
