The faculty of the school is composed of the very best teachers of their respective subjects. Several of them are University Professors and all are specialists in the subjects they teach at the Summer School.

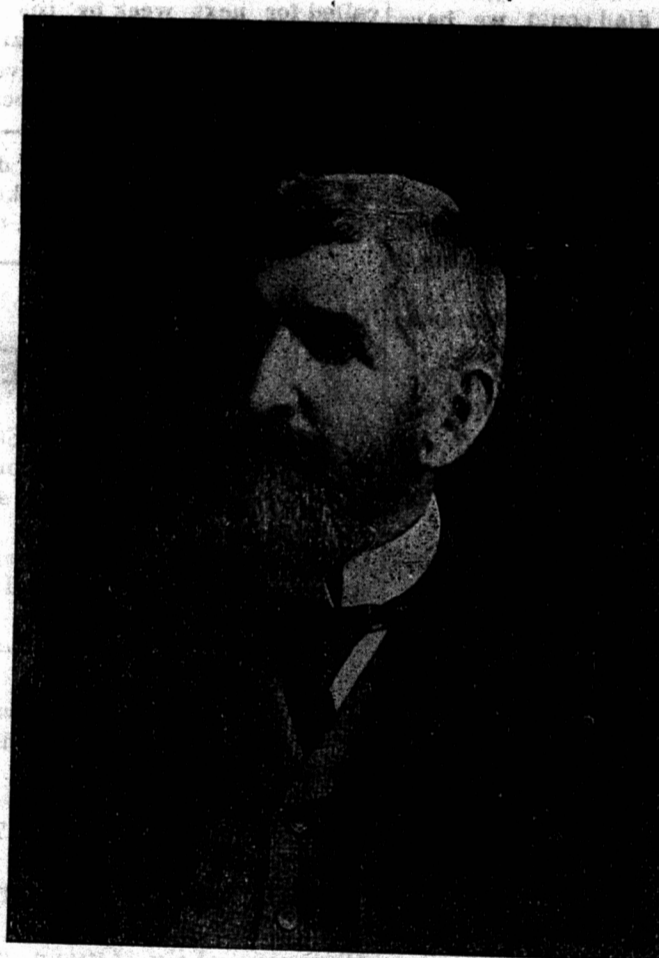
