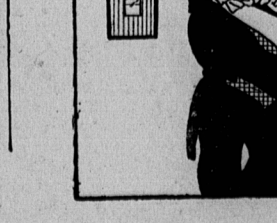

(Continued from Page 1) It was felt, the absence of replies from France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Belgium, and Norway, was nothing to worry about because all of them originally had agreed to a much stronger truce accord than the revised version the United Kingdom finally found acceptable.

DETAILS NOT DIVULGED

Details of the interchange between the United Kingdom and the United States were not completely divulged. In announcing the tentative agreement yesterday, Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald said there remained 'the settlement of the actual words and the protection of the essential position of both governments'—referring, apparently, to British negotiations with other countries concerning commercial agreements already under way.
