HIGH PRICES FOR ABERDEEN ANGUS CATTLE. - The annual sales of pedigree Aberdeen Angus Cattle held last month in Perth, Scotland, a bull 11 months old sold for 480 guineas - which price, says the Scottish Farmer is the highest ever brought by an animal of the breed at public auction in Britain. He was bought for the Earl of Roseberry who has one of the best herds in Scotland. The average price obtained at this great sale was higher than ever before - 150 and 200 guineas being quite common - for yearlings. The high priced youngster mentioned above is a half brother of the yearling bull shown by John Richards at Toronto last autumn and which took first prize there and was sold to a breeder in Ontario.

STYLES THAT SET SPRING FASHIONS

For Gentlemen's Hats in The Year 1903

A Guardian Reporter Visits the Store of Messrs James Paton & Co and Inspects Their Splendid Stock.

From the Hat retailers' standpoint spring has arrived, the calendar and weather conditions notwithstanding. All the spring blocks and new shapes are out. Now-a-days weather conditions do not govern the styles to any perceptible degree. The seasons govern the crops and foliage but not hats. True the anticipation of a season suggests changes in shapes and in styles in hats, and that same anticipation places the new things on the counters in advance of the times for which they are intended. The styles govern the seasons, for in the retail stores in the large cities are being shown spring styles in January and February - months of snow, storms, blizzards and ice, and what is more, they buy them, too. It is not consistency, it is business, and business keeps the factories running and the hat makers busy.

Yesterday The Guardian representative dropped into James Paton & Co's and had a hat chat with their hat man. He was shown over 80 dozens new spring blocks, all this season's import. The firm received last month by the S. S. Minto over 80 dozens of this season's shaper. Surely this evidence is strong enough to convince the most sceptical that a little thoughtfulness, consideration and anticipation on the part of this enterprising firm in placing an early order will result in easy selling.

The Guardian man was shown one of the celebrated Benson's Spring Derbys. This hat has a medium round, slightly tapered crown. The brim has a medium pitch in the front and rear, is neatly rolled at the sides and has a half inch curl. Another Spring Derby, same make: This block is considered to be one of the best shapes that the firm has imported. The hat has a round crown, the brim is rather flat set with a 1/2 in. roll and 1/2 x 16 inch Judic curl.

One of the newest soft Alpine styles or Fedoras has a tapered crown, rather wide brim rolled high at the sides and dipped in front and rear. The dimensions are 5 1/2 x 2 1/2. This is a general favorite and is selling well. It is carried in Black, Drab and Pearl Grey. The entire display of hats is most creditable to Messrs.
