ents are housed, it also kept in excellent condition. The old Prince Edward Island Hospital is also in good condition. There seems to be plenty additional room in that building. It may be that I am very pleased that the leader of the House has taken my suggestion last year and roofed the east wing, because it is an excellent building now, and I think we will be ever erecting the west wing there are some bricks there yet. I hope are long that the west wing will be just in as good condition as the east wing is at the present time. It is a nice thing to visit the institution, and it will be a credit to the Province that the east wing is well furnished, to my mind. The old site would be a great addition to the institution. (Applause).

Mr. Speaker Strong pointed out that on the contrary, the price of butter is 28 and 29 cents a pound in Montreal. The price of Australian butter landed on the London market today is 15 and 16 cents. If the same duty had been in force in Canada at this time as was in force when the Mackenzie King Government was in power, there would have been a loss to the farmers of this country today of from 12 to 13 cents a pound. (Applause).
