STOCKHOLM, July 6 (AP)—Given only a small chance to win, Ole Tandberg, Swedish heavyweight champion, tonight scored a stunning, upset victory over Joe Baksi of Kulpmont, Pa., in a 10-round bout and thus qualified to meet world titleholder Joe Louis for the crown in New York, Sept. 19.

A crowd of 25,000 in Rasunda Stadium saw the Swede, a three to one shot, gain a split decision over the American who hadn't lost a fight since 1945.

Tandberg, little known outside of his own country and not even considered much of a hope there, gave away six pounds to the former coal-miner, weighing 208 to Baksi's 214.

Tremendous applause greeted the verdict which gave Sweden its first heavyweight title contender in modern boxing history.

Tandberg, who had been beaten by Eddie Phillips of England and Karl Sjö of Belgium in recent years, withstood Baksi's slashing body attacks, cut Joe over the eye in the second round and bloodied his nose in the seventh.

CHICAGO, July 6 (AP)—Heavyweight champion Joe Louis guffawed loudly today when informed of Ole Tandberg's triumph over Joe Baksi in Stockholm, Sweden, and said "it looks like I won't fight anybody this year."

"I don't know a thing about Tandberg, and I don't see how the public would pay more than 15 cents to see a championship fight in which the contender pops out of nowhere like Tandberg," declared Louis.

He said, however, that Lew Burston, who saw the fight as a Twentieth Century representative, "may tell us that Tandberg is a worthy opponent."
