POLITICAL DISMISSAL TO BE PROBED

War Veterans Protest Action of N. S. Liberal Government.

HALIFAX, Oct. 2.—(C.P.)—Dismissal of Miss Ann Allan, superintendent of nurses at the Nova Scotia Sanatorium, is to be investigated, according to official announcement made tonight following a government meeting.

Following the advent of Nova Scotia's new government, Miss Allan was dismissed for "partisanship." The government's decision to investigate followed efforts towards her reinstatement made by President F. V. Clifford of the provincial command of the Canadian Legion.

The dismissed nurse had an enviable war record. Winner of the coveted Royal Red Cross, highest award in nursing, she was presented with the decoration by King George; she was mentioned by Sir Douglas Haig in despatches, and won the Mons Medal, the British war medal, and the Victory medal.
