A serious accident occurred at Kensington yesterday when a valuable horse belonging to Mr. Proff of that place ran into a train. Mr. Proff was taking the animal to the train for shipment to Charlottetown and when approaching the station it became scared of the incoming morning train and bolted towards the engine striking against the cars, the force of which threw the horse, and also Mr. Proff, to the ground. Mr. Proff received a bad shaking up, but with the exception of a few bruises is all right again. The horse was so badly injured that it had to be killed.

What came near being a serious accident occurred in Summerside yesterday morning about nine o'clock when a horse attached to a light wagon belonging to Mr. Lecky of Lot 16 started to run away, when near D. A. Pickering's, at the west end of the town. The horse ran up First street to Warren's corner, where the wagon was dropped, and continued towards Summer Street and while crossing struck Mrs. P. Brown who was walking down the street throwing her heavily to the ground and rendering her unconscious. Restoratives were given her and after a short time she came to. She was taken to her home in the afternoon and at last accounts was resting easily although badly bruised.

ST. JOHN FAIR CLOSES.

ST. JOHN, Sept. 15.—The Dominion Exhibition is now a thing of the past. The show closed last night after ten successful days.

The total attendance was 122,589 which is an increase over 1908 of 52,794 and is 51,576 ahead of 1907.

It will be sometime before the financial result of the fair is known as there is considerable work yet to be done by the officials in winding up affairs.

Mr Whitney urges the desirability of Canada establishing herself in the British market and strongly deplores any reciprocity arrangements with the United States.

RECIPROCITY TREATY OPENS.

BEVERLY, Mass., Sept. 15.—Negotiations for a reciprocity treaty between the United States and Canada will be opened next month.

It is learned in Beverly that the British Ambassador, James Bryce, has consented to negotiations being carried on directly with Canada and the United States, without the formality of being conducted through the British Ambassador.

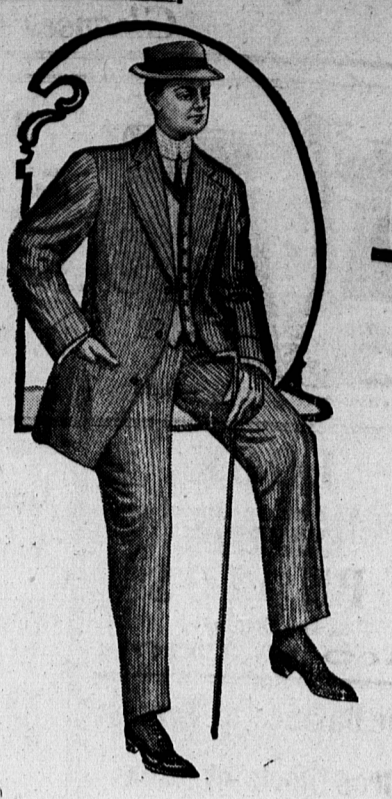
