IN MEMORIAM

ALEXANDER McMILLAN

On Wednesday February 4th, one of the Island's oldest citizens passed away in the person of Alexander McMillan of Brackley Point. In this connection a little family history is worthy of notice. In 1803 Lauchlin McMillan of Lochaber, Argyle, Scotland with his wife Sara McPherson immigrated to this Island in the ship "Polly" landing at Belfast, and in 1806 moved to Black Point Cove Head, settling on the land now occupied by his great-grandson John McMillan. They had a family of five - Donald, Marion, Ewen, John and Catherine. Catherine married Angus Bell of Belle River. John never married. Ewen married Ellen daughter of John Bell of Cove Head. Marion married Nell Leitch of Stanhope and daughter of Alexander Mutch of 48

Donald had a family of eleven of whom one, Donald, died in childhood and James died at about twenty two in California. The remaining nine all lived to pass the four score and eight years in July next. The like is seldom known. The family was certainly of a strong and sturdy physique and constitution, as is evidenced in the facts that three, Ewen, Angus and Sarah (Mrs. A. Smith) died at 85, John at 86, and Alexander at 98 and that the surviving four, Mrs. James Laird of New Glasgow, Charles of Cove Head, Robert of Brackley Point Road and Donald of Ruxtook range from 89 to 98 today. Their Grandfather Sarah McMillan died in 1856 at the age of 101 years.

Alexander, the subject of this notice, married Jean daughter of John Shaw of Brackley Point who preceded him by twenty years. One son John Archibald, died three years ago. A family of eight survive, all of whom were present and ministered to the best that loving human hands could do to the easements and comforts of the father as he rapidly sank towards the end of his life. On Jan. 22nd, in the last few days before death he met at twelve days in the facta neighbours assembled to tender birthday honors. The family are, Duncan Cymbria, Mrs. Henry Hooper, Margaret and Celia of Charlottetown, Mrs. Francis Mutch of Stanhope, Mrs. Charles Seaman of New Glasgow, Mrs. Charles Donald of Sydney, and William Malcolm on the home place. Mr. McMillan was for a great part of his life, a member of the Presbyterian Church at Cove Head and attended the same to within a few months of his death. On Friday the 6th a large gathering of friends from near and far attended his funeral, the services were conducted by Rev. W. E. Spencer assisted by Rev. D. McLean, and the remains were laid to rest in the family plot at Brackley Point. News acted as pall-bearers namely, John Hugh McMillan of Cornwall, John McMillan of West River, Donald McMillan of Charlottetown, Murdoch McMillan of Brackley Point Road, and Nathan, James R. Vendell and John McMillan of Cove Head.
