Baptist Conference Opened At S'ide

The Prince Edward Island Baptist Association met in annual session at Summerside last evening with a good attendance. In the absence of the Moderator, Rev. W. R. McWalker the vice Moderator, Rev. R. W. Lindsay presided. Two strong addresses on Social Service were given by Prof. Carl Dawson of McGill University and Dr. Shearer, Secretary of the Social Service Council of Canada.

Prof. Dawson compared the "homespun age" with modern times which he referred to as the age of machinery, automobiles, radio and aeroplanes have affected the social and religious life of today and a spirit of co-operation and brotherhood is needed to consolidate society. He urged the Christian people of this Province to greater efforts for the betterment of social and home conditions.

Dr. Shearer dwelt particularly with that part of the Lord's Prayer, petitioning "Thy Kingdom Come", which has an economic and social as well as a religious meaning. Everything anti-social should not be tolerated. He referred to the drink traffic, the gambling business and the sale of narcotic drugs in Canada, emphasizing also the importance of protecting dependent children and of curtailing the evils of unwholesome birth.

The conference is meeting again this morning.
