Literature And Life

THE BRIDGE OF LIFE
The "Vision of Mirza" is paper number 159 of the Spectator, and it has formed part of the early reading of some great English writers. It is an allegory of human life. There is the tide of water emerging from the dark and dipping into the dark again. There is the interesting feature of the scene. This bridge is human life, and consists of seventy arches and some broken ones besides; they correspond to the three-score and ten years of the Hebrew palmist. Originally there were one thousand arches but a great flood took most of them away. Now at most there are one hundred, but the last thirty are often broken. Only one traveler in a multitude ever reaches the hundred mark.

It was noted that a great many dropped in through the bridge soon after they began the journey. Infant mortality used to be very general, but now comparatively few die of the disease like diphtheria and scarlet fever, for medical science has got them more or less under control. There are family plots in some of our cemeteries where we may count four or five little graves, and the story is that they died of the diseases above named.

The observer noticed that the bridge was more populous at the middle, and then at the farther end few were seen, and they hobbled on, and soon fell out of sight. There were numerous pitfalls and traps by which travellers were victimized. What a commentary on this are the accidents of our time! Were Addison writing now he would have other contingencies which people would have to guard against. He spoke of some with pill-boxes and simulators who thrust pedestrians through the pitfalls—a hard blow at the medical fraternity of his day. Besides there were seen flocks of birds hovering over the bridge—symbols of the passions, and anxieties that infest human life.

The writer who gives an account of what he saw, says that he felt depressed at all this. When upon it he was told to lift his eyes and look beyond. There met his view a wonderful prospect, but it seemed to be divided by a huge rock. He saw but one side and it was most fascinating, for as far as the eye could see there were lovely lands covered with flowers and trees, and reposing there were countless happy people. He was told that these islands were the abode of souls who had been once inhabitants of this lower world but now were reaping the reward of nobility.
