The funeral of the late John Connolly, which took place on Friday last, was very largely attended. The C. M. B. A. and the K. of C. of which societies the deceased was a prominent member, headed the sorrowful procession. The universal sympathy felt, shows how much the deceased gentleman was esteemed while living and mourned departed from this life by his many friends. Those who knew him best realize that the place he occupied in church, society and business, will be hard to fill.

The following are the particulars of the funeral of the late Frank Carroll held Sunday afternoon from his late residence, Alley St., to the Cathedral where services were conducted by the Rev. Pius McDonald. As the funeral cortege entered and departed from the edifice the Dead March played by Miss Ethel Blanchard, who presided at the organ, wailed its mournful and solemn notes through the church where the deceased during his life had been a constant and faithful attendant. A large number followed the remains to its last resting place in the R. C. Cemetery. The services at the grave were conducted by Rev. P. McDonald. The pall bearers were: Chas. J. Mitchell, Patrick McTague, Arthur McQuaid, Harry Murphy, Percy Worth and Lester McInnis. The deceased was a young man of irreproachable character, a genial disposition, and a general favorite with all who knew him. The floral tributes were many including a wreath from a young Men's Society in Amherst of which he was a member. There were many spiritual bouquets from friends also many spiritual bouquets from friends of the deceased.

There departed this life on Tuesday the 26th day of January, Argyle Shore, Malcolm J. MacPhail at the advanced age of 78 years. He was one of the leading farmers of the community and by patient industry and honest effort had built up one of the finest homesteads in the neighborhood. He was a man of true Christian character and sterling qualities, and the loss sustained by his removal is very great and keenly felt. The community has lost an intelligent and highly respected citizen, the Church of Scotland a faithful and zealous member and the home a kind and affectionate father. The reality of his religion was not only exemplified in his life, but also in his death. During his last illness although brief, he manifested that humble resignation and calm attitude known only to the child of God, and recognized the beckoning hand and inviting call of his master, whom he had so faithfully followed. He has gone to his reward and leaves to mourn two brothers, Colin of Argyle Shore and Neil, abroad, and one sister Mrs. Flora McPhail of Argyle Shore, and an exceptionally devoted family consisting of two sons, John and Donald on the home-stead and six daughters, Mrs. Jas. McPhail of Argyle Shore, Mrs. Roderick McKinnon of De Sable, and Janie, Catherine, Florrie and Selina at home. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Jas. MacDougall and a large procession followed the remains to their last resting place at Argyle Shore Cemetery.

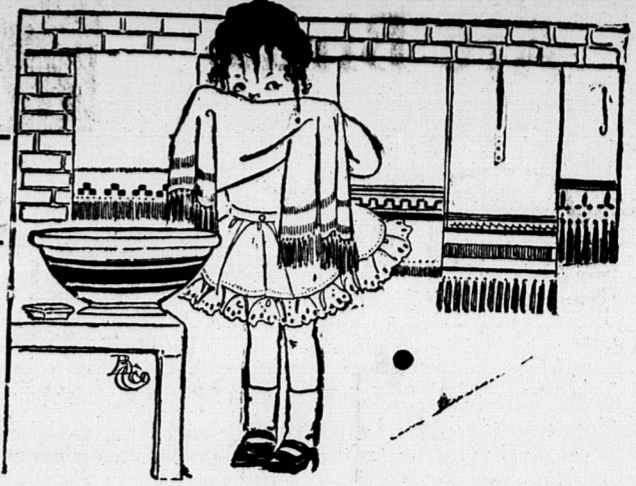
