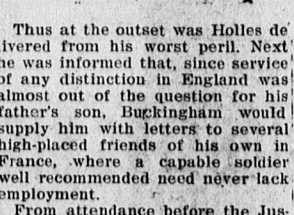

A Weekly Letter from London.

(From a Special Correspondent) London, April 11th, 1924

Numerous events in the English world of finance during the past week have brought about a substantial improvement in the best class of investment securities which augurs well for the future expansion of trade. To begin with national income and expenditure for the past financial year, which ended at the beginning of this month, showed a surplus of £48,329,000. Once again the surplus is due to underspending by our great state departments. This over-budgeting is becoming a habit and is meeting with considerable criticism. In the previous three years it amounted to £128,000,000, and in 1923-24 these huge sums of money automatically go to the reduction of the National Debt, there is a strong feeling in commercial circles that they would be much better employed in the reduction of the Income Tax and the expansion of trade.

These Budget estimates are looked upon by business men as a amount by which they have been unjustifiably taxed. Then the success of the Conversion of the 5 percent War Loan, the settlement of the Queensland Pastoral Leases controversy, and the flotation of big continental loans have also created a most favorable impression.

The attempt of Mr. Snowden, the Labour Chancellor of the Exchequer, to convert £200,000,000 of the 2,000,000,000, five percent War Loan into 4 1/2 percent loan at the rate of £103 which cannot be repaid before 1940 or 1941 at the latest is marked by a rise in the price of all British Funds. The impression is gaining ground that the Government is turning its serious attention to the whole question of Debt redemption and Debt conversion. Another good effect is that it has raised expectations of a considerable increase in the number and extent of the new capital issues for other investment stocks, and Colonial loans in particular have promptly responded to the rise in British Funds. The new short-term issue by Queensland for £12,700,000 is announced, while there is little doubt that the firmness of the investment market is maintained a number of loans and industrial issues will appear in the near future.

# TO STOP GAMES OF CHANCE

TORONTO, Ont., April 23.—An alarmingly large percentage of boys and girls in high schools occur during their leisure time with games of chance, according to W. H. Hunter, Supreme Court Ranger of the Independent Order of Foresters.

"These games of chance, in many cases are taught by the parents as social accomplishments," said Mr. Hunter, whose society has for years been active in child welfare and uplift work and maintains a home for orphan children at Oakville, Ont. "But they may easily become a serious character-demoralizing force.

"Children play with cards, mainly, but some of them play with dice, while others play for money, but large amounts, usually, but still they have a stake to play for. In a recent survey made in Wisconsin boys and girls in their teens testified that they spent from one to three hours a day playing cards.

"Any game of chance is likely to cause an effect on the person who engages in it habitually. Dependence upon luck causes the individual to rely upon chance in promoting his welfare rather than upon honest effort and hard work.

"The world to which our young people must learn to adjust themselves operates according to laws to cause an effect. Any practice that tends to develop capricious thinking proves detrimental. Appreciation of the real values of life is necessary if our youngsters are to become good citizens. Sound habits of thinking are inculcated in the children cared for in the Foresters' orphanage. These youngsters, who otherwise would be thrown on their own resources atmosphere."
